

11th Century Mosque Unearthed In Uzbekistan

A big mosque has been found by Soviet archaeologists beneath an almost two-metre layer of earth during the excavations of Afrasiab one of the world's largest ancient settlements in Uzbekistan.

The mosque was built in the 11-12th centuries. Beneath it, archaeologists found remnants of an earlier structure.

Uzbek archaeologists have also unearthed Afrasiab's city walls. built in various times, and the remains of an original aqueduct on brick arches!




