Radioactive, Main Source Of Earth's Internal ouHeat

Soviet "Scientists "Theory Radioactive elements provide the main source of the earth's internal heat. This view point, first put forward by the outstanding Soviet Scientist Vladimir Vernadsky (1863-1945), has been confirmed by Soviet Geophysi-

The earth's internal heat is the product of decay of the socalled long-lived radioactive elements a process under way for several billion years.

Although the generation of heat is constantly decreasing on our planet (five times more heat was generated in the early phases of the earth's history) the earth's core will begin cooling off in no less than 10 thousand million years, Geophysicist Elena Lyubimova told a Tass correspondent. The basic long-lived elements, uranium, potassium, thorium, are

to be found in millionth of fractions of a gram in all rocks. The energy released as a result of their decay has been the causative factor behind geological processes on the earth.
