The Graduation Rate 200 component of the IPEDS survey is a further extension of the traditional Graduation Rate component. GR200 carries over 100% and 150% graduation rate data from previous cohorts and requests any additional completers and exclusions between 150% and 200% of normal time to completion.

Data Reporting Reminders

The reporting of data for the 200% completion period is not cumulative. Respondents are asked to report data for the time period between 150% and 200% of normal time to completion only.
