A Proud Tradition

Founded in 1908 as the University of Omaha, the University of Nebraska at Omaha has evolved into a comprehensive public university that has received national and international recognition for some of its specialties. The University offers excellent academic programs, a lively intellectual and cultural atmosphere and a friendly campus.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha is a state-assisted university located in the heart of Nebraska's largest city. First established as a private nonsectarian college, the University's steady growth through the years eventually brought about its affiliation in the mid-1960s with the University of Nebraska. The merger created the University of Nebraska system, which includes the University of Nebraska at Omaha, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha.

One of the basic ideas for our University, one in which we take great pride, is a dedication to the liberal arts. We believe an educated person needs to learn to correlate, to see the relationships among concepts and phenomena, and to have an understanding of several academic disciplines. To bring about this process of intellectual integration, we require each student to take courses selected from the humanities, the social sciences and the natural sciences.

Another of our basic ideas is dedication to quality education of students. Since more than 80 percent of the faculty members here hold the highest degree in their field of study, many freshmen are taught by full professors and not teaching assistants, even in introductory-level courses.

Our faculty members bring a broad range of research expertise and public service commitment to their classrooms. "Real world" savvy is a strength of our faculty. Both faculty members and graduate students assist small business around the state through the Nebraska Business Development Center and other programs offered through the College of Business Administration. The University's Center for Public Affairs Research, a program of the College of Public Affairs and Community Service, coordinates the efforts of faculty and students who conduct original research on public affairs issues confronting the citizens of Nebraska. Similar opportunities exist in the arts, education, social work and other professions.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

RECIPIENT OF THE ORDER OF THE TOWER

CHARLES W. DURHAM

A builder by profession, Charles Durham has helped to shape the UNO of today and tomorrow through his generous gifts of time and philanthropy. The Durham Science Center on the University campus proudly bears the name of both Charles Durham and his wife, Margre. He was among the principal innovators of UNO's dynamic and rapidly growing Aviation Institute.

Currently the Chairman of the Board of Durham Resources, Mr. Durham also is chairman of Great Plains Natural Gas Company. A governor of the Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben and a member of the Strategic Air Command Consultation Committee, Mr. Durham is a past president of the Chief Executives' Organization and the Omaha Chamber of Commerce. He also served as a director of the University of Nebraska Foundation and was a former president of the Mid-America Boy Scouts Council. From 1948 to 1983, Mr. Durham was Chairman and CEO of one of the nation's largest architectural and engineering firms, Henningson, Durham and Richardson.

GLENN A. GOODRICH

State Senator Glenn A. Goodrich has represented the people of the 20th Legislative district since 1970. KERMIT HANSEN

The current "dean" of the University of Nebraska Board of Regents, Kermit Hansen will retire from the Board this month, having first been appointed in 1969, elected in 1972, and re-elected in 1978 and 1984. He has served with particular distinction, providing the Board with leadership and UNO with guidance and loyalty. During his career, Regent Hansen attended dozens of classes and made, literally, hundreds of visits to the campus to learn, observe, and offer insight.

Regent Hansen is a consultant to the American Bankers Association and is the retired chairman of the U.S. National Bank of Omaha. He is the president of Financial Perspectives Company and is a member of the Boards of Directors for the Crisis Line and the Greater Omaha Housing and Community Development Corporation. A member of the Board of the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems, he also served on the Nebraska Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education from 1974 to 1989.
