A Proud Tradition

Founded in 1908 as the University of Omaha, the University of Nebraska at Omaha has evolved into a comprehensive public university that has received national and international recognition for some of its specialties. The University offers excellent academic programs, a lively intellectual and cultural atmosphere and a friendly campus.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha is a state-assisted university located in the heart of Nebraska's largest city. First established as a private nonsectarian college, the University's steady growth through the years eventually brought about its affiliation in the mid-1960s with the University of Nebraska. The merger created the University of Nebraska system, which includes the University of Nebraska at Omaha, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha.

One of the basic ideas for our University, one in which we take great pride, is a dedication to the liberal arts. We believe an educated person needs to learn to correlate, to see the relationships among concepts and phenomena, and to have an understanding of several academic disciplines. To bring about this process of intellectual integration, we require each student to take courses selected from the humanities, the social sciences and the natural sciences.

Another of our basic ideas is dedication to quality education of students. Since more than 80 percent of the faculty members here hold the highest degree in their field of study, many freshmen are taught by full professors and not teaching assistants, even in introductory-level courses.

Our faculty members bring a broad range of research expertise and public service commitment to their classrooms. "Real world" savvy is a strength of our faculty. Both faculty members and graduate students assist small business around the state through the Nebraska Business Development Center and other programs offered through the College of Business Administration. The University's Center for Public Affairs Research, a program of the College of Public Affairs and Community Service, coordinates the efforts of faculty and students who conduct original research on public affairs issues confronting the citizens of Nebraska. Similar opportunities exist in the arts, education, social work and other professions.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

RECIPIENT OF THE ORDER OF THE TOWER

WALTER SCOTT JR.

Walter Scott Jr., president and chairman of the board of Peter Kiewit Sons', Inc., has been employed by the Kiewit organization since 1953. An active civic leader and strong supporter of the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Mr. Scott received the Honorary Doctor of Letters from UNO in 1983.

Mr. Scott, a graduate of Colorado State University, has been active as chairman/president of many organizations including the Heritage-Joslyn Foundation, Joslyn Art Museum Board of Governors, Omaha Zoo Foundation and the Omaha Zoological Society. He also has served as director of the Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben, Bishop Clarkson Memorial Hospital, the Nebraska Game and Parks Foundation, the Omaha Development Council, SAC Museum Memorial Society and United Arts/Omaha.

Recipient of the Perry W. Branch Distinguished Service Award from the University of Nebraska Foundation in 1989, Mr. Scott has received many academic and service honors including the Brotherhood Award for the National Conference of Christians and Jews; the Philanthropist of the Year Award from the National Society of Fund Raising Executives; Man of the Year Award from the Mid-America Council, Boy Scouts of America; Honor Alumnus of the Colorado State University College of Engineering; and the Spirit of Youth Award for the Uta Halee Girls Village in Omaha.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENTS

The University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) Alumni Association awards the Citation for Alumnus Achievement Award to three distinguished alumni. The awards are presented each year at spring commencement to graduates who have achieved distinction in their chosen fields. This year's honorees are Charles D. Piatt, Ree Schonlau and Alfred G. Thomsen.

CHARLES D. PLATT

Charles D. Piatt earned a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Omaha in 1953. He also holds a master of business administration degree from the Columbia University School of Business.

Piatt, of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is president and chief operating officer for Alamo Rent-A-Car, a position he has held since 1989. He joined Alamo in 1987 as executive vice president responsible for the finance, administration, operations and corporate affairs divisions.

Piatt worked for General Motors Acceptance Corporation for 34 years. During his career with GMAC, he served as vice president of overseas operations and vice president of Eastern U.S. and Canadian operations. Prior to retirement, he was liaison with GMAC's mortgage banking activities.

REE SCHONLAU

Ree Schonlau graduated with a bachelor of fine arts degree from UNO in 1968. She is founder and executive director of the Alternative Worksite/Bemis Foundation in Omaha, a position she has held since 1985.

Schonlau was a studio artist for 11 years. She was founder and director of the Ree Schonlau Gallery from 1971-84 and founder and director of the Alternative Worksite, Artist-In-Industry Program from 1980-84. Since 1971, Schonlau has originated and presented 129 exhibitions and 48 workshops.

Currently, she is a consultant appointed by the mayor for the Public Art Programs for the City of Omaha. At UNO, she has served as a consultant for the College of Fine Arts Strategic Planning Committee and for the chancellor's office to allocate artwork for new university buildings. She has served as a board member for the Mayor's Council on the Public Arts, Friend of the Parks, Landmarks Incorporated and the Kansas City Contemporary Arts Society.

Schonlau was named 1988 Woman of the Year by the Omaha YWCA and 1987 Woman of the Year by the Girl Scouts of America. She received the Nebraska Arts Award from the Associated Artists of Omaha in 1982 and the Award for Art Achievements from the Arts in Omaha in 1980.

Alfred G. Thomsen received a bachelor of science degree from the University of Omaha in 1957. He is president and treasurer of the Alfred G. Thomsen Company in Omaha, which he founded in 1969.
