## Morning Plenary:

### The Challenge of Putting the Movement Back into the Labor Movement

*Tefere Gebre*, Executive Vice President of the AFL-CIO There was a period following WWII when Americans understood the his- toric role that organized labor played in raising levels of fairness and jus- tice in the workplace and community. That understanding has been wide- ly forgotten or distorted. This plenary will explore what the AFL-CIO is doing today to revitalize the labor movement and insure our economy works for all wage earners.

The following three workshops will run 75 minutes each and will be re-peated three times during the conference:

## Understanding Labor's Community Engagement

*Ana Aveñdano*, Vice President, Labor Participation, United Way Worldwide The stereotype that unions only care about what's happening in the work- place is erroneous and only tells part of organized labor's story. This workshop will explore the ways that organized labor is vitally connected to the well-being of all wage earners and the communities in which they live.

### Understanding the Role that Big Money plays in Electoral Politics and Public Policy

**Shane Larson**, Legislative Director for the Communication Workers of America Dating back to the Gilded Age, big money has historically played a dis- torting role in electoral politics. It was lessened some through legislative reform in the 20th Century. The Supreme Court's 2010 Citizens United and 2014 McCutcheon decisions and the enactment of the CR-Omnibus bill have opened the doors for big money to play a role in who gets elect- ed and what public policy is enacted. This workshop will examine the role big money has played in the past and present political environment.

## Where is the Affordable Care Act Today?

**Donald Frey**, M.D. Professor of Family Medicine, Creighton University The Affordable Care Act (ACA), as with all legislation, was the result of political compromises. The ACA is a step forward in health care coverage for all Americans. Its roll out was troubled, and it remains the subject of much controversy. This workshop will examine why there's a need for the ACA, what it aims to do, and how successfully or poorly it's been ac- complishing its task.

*Steward Acuff*, Organizing Director of the National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees Stewart has been a labor activist nearly all of his adult life. He has served in many capacities and brings a wealth of knowledge to examining the ways that participants can use the knowledge they gained during the con-ference to make a difference in their communities.
