ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

JAMES HAWES II

James Hawes II currently serves as Vice President and Chief Executive Officer-Nebraska for U S WEST Communications. In this role he is senior officer for U S WEST Communications in the state of Nebraska. Prior to November 1, 1990, he served as Executive Director-Finance and Marketing.

His educational accomplishments include a B.B.A. from Morehouse College, a M.B.A. from Atlanta University, and a M.S. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Mr. Hawes joined Northwestern Bell in late 1984 as Manager-Strategic Planning and has since held positions as Director of Finance, General Manager-Financial Operations and Planning and Executive Director-Consumer Division. He was honored by being selected as the U S WEST candidate to attend the year-long Executive Management Program and the Sloan School at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. During this period, he toured the three Chinas, studying the three economies and sharing different management strategies.

ISIDORE MICHAEL TRETIK

Mr. Tretiak began his education in Russian and Hebrew classes at the age of 5 in the Ukraine. After he immigrated to the U.S. in 1922, he continued with Hebrew. He began working at age 11, carrying a newspaper route; later, he worked in a drugstore delivering orders on a bicycle, and advanced into an all-around helper working after school and weekends.

After grade school and high school in Omaha, he enrolled in the Van Sant School of Business evening classes for a year. As he grew older, he found employment with the Omaha Jobbing Company, and remained with this firm for many years where he acquired valuable retailing and merchandising experience.

The dream of someday going into business for himself became a reality. At the urging of Suppliers and Associates and with a loan from the Omaha National Bank, he founded Tretiak's - a wholesaler and retailer of paints and coatings, wallcovering, floor covering, decorating supplies, and hundreds of related items. Over the many successful years of growth, Tretiak's has become the largest store of its kind in Omaha and surrounding area.

After his retirement from the business world, Mr. Tretiak enrolled at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (1979); in 1984 he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education and continued to take classes to further his knowledge.

He has been the recipient of many honors and awards and has served the community in numerous boards and organizations. He and his wife, Selma Seka Tretiak, were honored by the Omaha Jewish community in June of 1991 for their many years of volunteerism, leadership, and financial support.
