ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

They have a belief in the University's destiny and this dedication has resulted in a kind of genius that merits special attention. The Chancellor's Medal is one means of recognizing these people. It is bestowed only to those within the University community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

DENISE FANDEL

Denise Fandel, ATC, has served as the head athletic trainer for the Athletic Department at the University of Nebraska at Omaha since 1983 and as an instructor in the Division of Physical Therapy Education in the School of Allied Health at the University of Nebraska Medical Center since 1992. She has also taught classes in drug awareness, healthful living, safety and prevention of injuries and first aid. The athletic training program she developed for UNO is one of the few programs in the state.

In addition to coordinating all of the first aid courses and serving on several other committees in the School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, Fandel has provided athletic training services to the "Moving Company" dance troupe and participated in and co-facilitated the Prejudice Reduction Training workshop.

Fandel also has generously given of her time to the community. She has served as a lecturer at the Brown Bag Seminars and National Employee Health and Fitness Day at ConAgra, as an instructor of CPR to the coaching staff of the Omaha Volleyball Club, and as the host athletic trainer for the USA Women's Paralympic Wheelchair Basketball Team Training Camp.

Fandel has also been published in the *Journal of the National Athletic Trainers' Association* and has written chapters in several other books regarding sports medicine.

As a leader in the training room, Fandel has been cited by students, faculty and staff as a caring supporter of students in athletic and scholastic endeavors as a representative of the University.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

VINCENT J. WEBB, PH.D.

Vincent J. Webb, Ph.D., serves as chair of the Department of Criminal Justice at the University of Nebraska at Omaha where he also holds the rank of professor and graduate faculty fellow. Dr. Webb joined the UNO faculty in 1973. His research and teaching interests include criminal justice policy, victimization, violence, and police community relations.

A Bloomfield, Nebraska native, Dr. Webb holds a B.A. from the University of Omaha, a M.A. from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, and a Ph.D. from Iowa State University. As a master's student, he was awarded a fellowship with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, and he was a research associate while pursuing doctoral studies at Iowa State. He has authored or co-authored four books and dozens of research reports, journal articles, and papers presented at a variety of regional, national, and international professional meetings.

Dr. Webb has been extensively involved in the development of the field of criminal justice. From 1979-1981 he served as Principal Investigator for the Joint Commission on Criminology and Criminal Justice Education and Standards. He is a past president of the Midwest Association of Criminal Justice Education and of the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences, and was named an ACJS Academy Fellow in 1988.

In addition to serving as Chair of the Department of Criminal Justice, Dr. Webb served as Director of UNO's Center for Applied Urban Research for six years. His other service to the University includes membership on the Faculty Senate, the UNO Graduate Council, the University Committee on Research, and a variety of other committees.

Dr. Webb also provides assistance to the community and criminal justice agencies through service on boards and committees. Some recent service includes membership on the Corrections Task Force of the Omaha Community Partnership, the Omaha Corrections Center Community Advisory Board, and the Douglas County Youth Detention Center Advisory Board.
