ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

JOHN NEWTON

John Newton, Ph.D., received his BS in psychology from Union College in Schenectady, New York in 1951. He earned his master's and doctorate degrees at The Ohio State University in 1952 and 1955, respectively. Dr. Newton first worked as a research assistant focusing on a variety of basic and applied problems of human learning. He also taught psychology courses at The Ohio State University from 1953 to 1955. While serving in the United States Army from 1955 to 1957, Dr. Newton conducted research in physiological psychology and human engineering.

Dr. John Newton joined the faculty of the University of Nebraska at Omaha in September 1960. He served first as assistant professor and later as associate professor in the department of psychology. In 1967, Dr. Newton became chairman of the department of psychology. In February 1975, he was appointed dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

Dr. Newton has shared his knowledge gained from research through numerous published articles and technical reports. He has presented many convention papers based on topics ranging from computer-aided instruction to the effects of environmental complexity and locomotor activity on rats. He has also shared his expertise with the business world as an industrial training program consultant.

His professional affiliations include: American Psychological Association; Midwestern Psychological Association; Nebraska Psychological Association, of which he served as a member of the Executive Board from 1969-1971 and again from 1972-1974; Psi Chi; and the Psychonomic Society.

In today's speech, Dr. Newton poses the question, "What did you learn in college?"

THE CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL

The Chancellor's Medal of the University of Nebraska at Omaha was established to recognize the contributions of faculty and administrative staff which are a mixture of academic prowess, physical vigor, the ability to visualize social structure and an applied sense of humanity.

People are responsible for the growth of vitality of institutions. At the University of Nebraska at Omaha we are fortunate to have men and women who have accepted this charge. They have a belief in the University's destiny and this dedication has resulted in a kind of genius that merits special attention. The Chancellor's Medal is one means of recognizing these people. It is bestowed only to those within the University community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

OTTO BAUER

Otto F. Bauer, Ph.D., was born in Elgin, Illinois. He received his BS (1953), MA (1955), and his Ph.D. (1959) in public address and group communication from Northwestern University. Dr. Bauer served in the United States Air Force as an officer and pilot for four years. During those years, he was the director of debate, instructor, and assistant professor of English at the United States Air Force Academy.

Dr. Bauer has taught courses at all levels of instruction at the Air Force Academy, Bowling Green State University, University of Wisconsin-Parkside, and the University of Nebraska at Omaha. He has also served on many educational committees and councils during his career. He is also the author of various published case studies, articles, papers, and books which reflect his knowledge and research in the field of communication.

Dr. Bauer joined the University of Nebraska at Omaha faculty in 1979 as a professor of communication and vice chancellor for Academic Affairs. In July, 1993, his title expanded to vice chancellor for Academic Affairs and dean of Graduate Studies. His leadership style during his fifteen years at UNO has been described as "dedicated, caring, and just." In July of this year, Dr. Bauer retired from his position.

At the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Dr. Bauer instituted a program review process used by the Academic Planning Council. He also helped to establish UNO as an independent doctoral-granting institution accredited by the North Central Association. Dr. Bauer served as chairman of the Steering Committee on Assessment, the Committee on Admissions Criteria, the Chancellor's Commission on Institutional Directions and Priorities, the Council of Academic Deans, the Academic Planning Council, and the Education Policy Advisory Committee.

Dr. Bauer will return to the classroom in the spring semester of 1995.

SHIRLEY PETROWSKI
