

APRIL 15 Nebraskans United for Food (NUFF) will host a protest rally at the Civic Auditorium to be followed by a march to the Federal Building at 17th & Capitol Streets. The activities will begin at 10:00 a.m. Representatives of your Indian Center will be present, and we will report the particulars to you in the next edition of the HONGA.

Activities will include the dedication of a plaque depicting Ponca Chief Standing Bear's life which will be presented by Fred Thomas of the Omaha World-Herald. Mayoral candidate, Mike Boyle, will be honored at this event for his strong support of the American Indian community.

In addition, there will be a pot luck, and everyone is asked to help us share in the feast. Also, in keeping with the spirit of our celebration, everyone is encouraged to wear traditional Indian regalia.
