ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's and master's degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program.

GENERAL JOHNNIE E. WILSON

General Johnnie Edward Wilson was born on February 4, 1944. He was raised in Lorain, Ohio and entered the Army in 1961 as an enlisted soldier. Gen. Wilson attained the rank of staff sergeant before attending Officer Candidate School (OCS). On completion of OCS in 1967, he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Ordnance Corps. He was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Nebraska at Omaha. He also holds a Master of Science degree in logistics management from the Florida Institute of Technology. In May 1998, Gen. Wilson was awarded an honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, by the Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University. His military education includes completion of the Ordnance Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Army Command and General Staff College, and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

Gen. Wilson held a wide variety of important command and staff positions culminating in his current assignment as the commanding general, U.S. Army Materiel Command. Other key assignments include: deputy chief of staff for logistics, Department of the Army, Pentagon; chief of staff, U.S. Army Materiel Command; commanding general, 21st Theater Army Area Command, U.S. Army Europe and 7th Army; commander, 13th Support Command, Fort Hood, Texas; and commander, Division Support Command, 1st Armored Division, U.S. Army Europe.

Gen. Wilson served with distinction at every level of command. He commanded three times at the company level: a maintenance company in the 82d Airborne Division as a first lieutenant, followed by command of a supply and services company in Vietnam with the 173d Airborne Brigade, and a maintenance company with the 1st Armored Division in Europe. At the lieutenant colonel level, Gen. Wilson commanded the 709th Maintenance Battalion, 9th Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, which converted and became the Army's first Main Support Battalion. Gen. Wilson commanded twice at the colonel level serving as the Division Support Command (DISCOM) Commander of the 1st Armored Division followed by command of the 13th Support Command at Fort Hood, Texas.

Gen. Wilson next served as the deputy commanding general, 21st Theater Army Area Command (TAACOM), the Army's largest and most diverse logistics unit. Based on his wide experience with leading soldiers, Wilson was selected to command the Ordnance Center and School responsible for the training and professional development of thousands of soldiers, non-commissioned officers and officers every year. Following this successful assignment, he served as the chief of staff, Army Materiel Command, where he was responsible for resource and personnel management for a work force with over 80,000 military and civilian members. From 1994 to 1996, Gen. Wilson served as the deputy chief of staff for logistics, Department of Army, where he was responsible for worldwide logistics.

Awards and decorations given to Gen. Wilson include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Special Forces Tab, Master Parachutist Badge and the Army Staff Identification Badge.

Gen. Wilson is married to the former Helen McGhee of Elyria, Ohio, and they have three children and five grandchildren.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha Alumni Association awards the Citation for Alumnus Achievement Award to distinguished alumni. The award is presented each year at commencement to graduates who have achieved distinction in their chosen fields.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

JOHN T. FARR, PH.D.

John T. Farr, associate vice chancellor for academic affairs at the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO), was born July 10, 1937. He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at Texas Christian University in 1959 and 1960, respectively. Dr. Farr received his doctorate in government from the University of Texas at Austin in 1969, following two years of service in the U.S. Army. His principal fields were comparative politics, American politics and public administration.

Dr. Farr began his long record of service with UNO in 1969 when he joined the faculty of the political science department. His first major leadership role came in 1973 when he was elected vice president of the Faculty Senate. Since then, Dr. Farr has served on over 25 university and intercampus committees, chairing several of them. He assumed his position as associate vice chancellor for academic affairs in 1989, having served in a variety of roles in the Office of Academic Affairs since 1974.

Many major projects at UNO come under Dr. Farr's guidance. Most recently, he coordinated the self-study process for UNO's comprehensive institutional reaccreditation review by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools in 1997. The process was a familiar one for Dr. Farr, having coordinated the reviews in 1976 and 1987. All reviews resulted in reaccreditation for 10 years. He also coordinates UNO's internal academic program review process. In the early 1990s, Dr. Farr played a major role in developing the plans for the Aviation Institute.

Dr. Farr is the author of various papers on the topics of university self-study and political science, as well as numerous internal studies and reports. He also has conducted workshops for self-study coordinators for the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

The Chancellor's Medal of the University of Nebraska at Omaha was established to recognize the contributions of faculty and administrative staff which are a mixture of academic prowess, physical vigor, the ability to visualize social structure and applied sense of humanity.

People are responsible for the growth of vitality of institutions. At the University of Nebraska at Omaha we are fortunate to have men and women who have accepted this charge. They have a belief in the University's destiny and this dedication has resulted in a kind of genius that merits special attention. The Chancellor's Medal is one means of recognizing these people. It is bestowed only to those within the University community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.
