ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

GORDON MUNDELL, PH.D.

Today's commencement address, "A Cultured Life," will be delivered by Gordon Mundell, linguistics professor in the University of Nebraska at Omaha's Department of English. He holds a doctorate in linguistics from The University of Rochester, a master's degree from The American University, and a bachelor's degree in Spanish from the University of Colorado-Boulder.

Prior to coming to UNOmaha in 1974, Professor Mundell taught at the University of Dayton. He established the linguistics program at UNOmaha and has served his university and discipline in a wide range of activities, including the chairmanship of his department; various positions in the faculty senate and the American Association of University Professors; faculty sponsorship of the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi; the editorship of the university's recent North Central accreditation self-study; participation in the Nebraska LEAD (Leadership Education/Action Development) Program of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Nebraska Agricultural Leadership Council, Inc.; and numerous committee assignments addressing the curriculum of his department, college, and university.

He is a past recipient of an alumni association award for outstanding teaching. A member of the graduate faculty and a translator of the Argentinean poet Olga Bressano de Alonso, Professor Mundell is currently working on a book entitled "The Manners and Customs of American Conversation." Dr. Mundell will retire from the UNOmaha in May after 35 years of teaching.

STUDENT COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

JENNIFER WILSON

Jennifer Wilson's commencement address is titled "Oh the Places You'll Go!" Ms. Wilson graduates today from the University of Nebraska at Omaha Summa Cum Laude with a double major in philosophy and political science. She was also an honor student of Millard North High School graduating in the spring of 1995.

As an honor student at UNOmaha, Ms. Wilson has been an active member of the Golden Key National Honor Society, Phi Gamma Mu National Honor Society, Omicron Delta Kappa National Honor Society, Phi Kappa Phi National Honor Society, Phi Alpha Theta National Honor Society and in the Honors Program. In addition to her studies, she has completed her Honors Program Thesis: "Intuition as the Guide to Knowledge; an Exploration in Epistemology, with Emphasis on the Thought of Descartes, Locke, Hume, and Kant."

After graduation, Ms. Wilson plans to spend a year at UNOmaha devoted to further research and publishing related to the fields of philosophy and political science. Ms. Wilson plans to explore further study in German language and physics. Beginning with the fall of 2000, she intends to begin working toward a doctorate in philosophy with an emphasis on epistemology. Her long-term goal is becoming a professor of philosophy.

ORDER OF THE TOWER

DAVID SOKOL

David Sokol, serves as chairman and chief executive officer of CalEnergy Company, Inc. Mr. Sokol's extensive experience and leadership has transformed CalEnergy into a leading global provider of a full range of energy services. Under his management, he guided CalEnergy to become one of the world's largest independent energy producers and successfully acquired Northern Electric pic, a regional electricity distribution and supply company in the United Kingdom. CalEnergy, which manages and owns interests in over 5,000 net megawatts of power generation facilities in operation, construction and development worldwide, currently operate 19 generating facilities and supplies and distributes electricity to 1.5 million customers.

Mr. Sokol's knowledge and expertise also guided the start-up of Ogden Martin Systems, Inc. into a \$1.7 billion publicly held company and industry leader. His past experience in the energy industry also includes serving as chief executive officer for Kiewit Energy Company.

His community service involvement includes board memberships with Omaha's Joslyn Art Museum, the Mid-American Council of the Boy Scouts of America, the University of Nebraska at Omaha Alumni Association, STRATCOM Consultation Committee, River City Roundup and Rodeo, the Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben, the Omaha Airport Authority, the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation of the Metropolitan Omaha Convention/Sports and Entertainment Authority and anticipation in and support of many other philanthropic efforts.

Mr. Sokol has a degree in civil engineering from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and an Honorary Doctorate from Bellevue University. For all of his service and contributions to the University, it is with great pleasure that David Sokol is awarded the Order of the Tower.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha's highest non-academic award, the Order of the Tower, was first presented in 1964. Since that time, more than 70 individuals have received this honor which symbolizes an ongoing commitment to the growth and development of the University.

The Order of the Tower is bestowed upon community leaders whose service and/or financial support has made it possible for the University to address the academic, cultural and economic needs of the people of Omaha and citizens of the State of Nebraska. Recipients of the award embody virtues attributes valued highly by the University and are recognized as an example to others.

Julie Totten is currently the assistant vice chancellor for Business and Finance and director of Finance of the University of Nebraska at Omaha. As the assistance vice chancellor for Business and Finance, Ms. Totten is responsible for the planning, control and direction of the financial functions of the University which include the Controller's Office, Budget Office, Grants Accounting, Student Accounts/Cashiering, Operations Analysis, and Purchasing. In addition she works closely with the vice chancellor in all areas of Business and Finance.

In addition to her regular duties, Ms. Totten currently serves or has recently served on many committees including the Strategic Planning Steering Committee, University-wide Administrative System Project Steering Committee, Computer Usage Committee, NCA Self-Study Steering Committee, Student Housing Planning Committee, Fee Review Committee. She has also served on the search committees for the UNOmaha director of Institutional Research and the assistant vice president for business and finance of the University of Nebraska.

Ms. Totten has a bachelor of science degree with an emphasis in accounting the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. For her dedication and service, the University takes pride in recognizing Julie Totten who is awarded the Chancellor's Medal.
