DEFINITIONS

MULTI-CAMPUS INSTITUTION. An organization bearing a resemblance to an institutional system, but unequivocally designated as a single institution with either of two organizational structures: (1) an institution having two or more campuses responsible to a central administration (which central administration may or may not be located on one of the administratively equal campuses) or (2) an institution having a main campus with one or more branch campuses attached to it.

MAIN CAMPUS. In those institutions comprised of a main campus and one or more branch campuses, the main campus (sometimes called the parent institution) is usually the location of the core, primary, or most comprehensive program. Unless the institution-wide or central administrative office for such institutions is reported to be at a different location, the main campus is also the location of the central administrative office.

BRANCH CAMPUS. A campus of an institution of higher education which is organized on a relatively permanent basis (i.e., has a relatively permanent administration), which offers an organized program or programs of work of at least 2 years (as opposed to courses), and which is located in a community different from that in which its parent institution is located. To be considered in a community different from that of the parent institution, a branch shall be located beyond a reasonable commuting distance from the main campus of the parent institution.

INSTITUTIONAL SYSTEM. A complex of two or more institutions of higher education, each separately organized or independently complete, under the control or supervision of a single administrative body.

MANDATORY VERSUS VOLUNTARY REPORTING

MANDATORY REPORTING

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requires that services and benefits provided by recipients of Federal financial assistance be offered without regard to race, color, or national origin. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 requires that, with certain exceptions, the services and benefits of federally assisted educational programs and activities be offered without discrimination on the basis of sex. This report is one indicator utilized by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) in carrying out its responsibilities to verify compliance with Title VI and Title IX.

The portions of this report which relate to racial/ethnic data are to be completed by all institutions of higher education that receive, are applicants for, or expect to be applicants for Federal financial assistance as defined in the HEW Regulation implementing Title VI (45 CFR 80.13), or as defined in any HEW Regulation implementing Title IX. If your institution does not fall into any of these categories, please inform us of this fact.

Section 80.6(b) of the Regulation implementing Title VI (a portion of which is set forth below) and similar provisions of the Title VI Regulations of other Federal agencies, authorize collection of this information.

VOLUNTARY REPORTING

Those institutions to which these regulations do not apply are not required to complete this questionnaire, which is authorized by law (P.L. 93-380). However, it is hoped that institutions not subject to the provisions of Title VI and Title IX will voluntarily complete all portions of the survey (or at least all except the racial/ethnic data portions) as they have done in the past. Doing so will enable the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) to continue to publish complete data on earned degrees for the Nation, the States, and individual institutions.

This survey constitutes an integral part of the comprehensive system of statistics on higher education collected by NCES as part of the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS). As such it collects basic data widely used by planners and researchers.

COMBINED REPORTING

In recent years the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) has collected some data on degrees conferred by racial/ethnic category from selected States. In order to lighten the burden on reporting institutions by eliminating the considerable duplication of effort in reporting to two separate agencies, the OCR survey has been combined with this survey form and integrated into the HEGIS program.

SURVEY COVERAGE

This report is divided into 3 parts.

PART A is concerned with first-professional degrees only.

PART B is concerned with bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees.

PART C is concerned with awards below the bachelor's level (Associate degrees and other formal awards).

Many institutions will appropriately skip one or more of the 3 parts and one or more of the divisions within Parts B and C. If a particular part (A, B, or C) does not apply to your institution, please indicate that fact in the space provided and forward that page along with those pages completed.

If you will identify the divisions in which your institution grants degrees

by circling the appropriate page numbers in the contents on page 2, it will be helpful.

- 1. INCLUSIVE DATES. Report only those degrees (including awards in Part C) which were actually conferred between July 1, 1976, and June 30, 1977. Degrees earned but not yet conferred during this time period should be reported in next year's survey.
- 2. INSTITUTIONAL COVERAGE. A separate report is requested from each branch or member of a system, as well as from each entirely independent institution and each "parent" institution. Please provide the information requested in item 6 on the cover page, which is intended to permit complete identification of the reporting unit. Do not include degrees conferred by branches of your institution located in foreign countries.
- 3. CONSULTATION ON PROBLEMS. If clarification of the definitions and instructions is needed, please consult the associate survey director, Mrs. Agnes Q. - 5. MAJOR CHANGES. If the number of degrees you report in any area is significantly larger or smaller than the number you reported last year, it will be most helpful if you will include explanatory notes on the form or on an accompanying sheet of paper. If degrees were conferred for the first time in 1976-77 in a discipline specialty new to your institution, please indicate by circling the "line number" in column 3. If your institution now awards degrees at a different level in a specialty in which you awarded degrees prior to 1976-77, please circle the cells in the appropriate degree fields.
- 6. RACIAL/ETHNIC DATA. In Part A the number of graduates in each first-professional field should be shown by racial/ethnic category. In Parts B and C racial/ethnic summaries are requested for each discipline division. The definitions for these categories are:

Non-resident alien. A person who is not a citizen of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Resident aliens, non-citizens who have been lawfully admitted for permanent residence (and who hold a "green card".—Form I-151), are to be reported in the appropriate racial/ethnic categories along with United States citizens. Non-resident aliens are to be reported separately, on the lines provided, rather than in any of the five racial/ethnic categories which follow.

Black, non-Hispanic. A person having origins in any of the black racial groups (except those of Hispanic origin).

American Indian or Alaskan Native. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America.

Asian or Pacific Islander. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

Hispanic. A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, non-Hispanic. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, the Middle East or the Indian subcontinent (except those of Hispanic origin).

Racial/ethnic designations as used in this survey do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. For the purpose of this report, a student may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded in the community as belonging. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic group.

The manner of collecting the racial/ethnic information is left to the discretion of the institution provided that the system which is established results in reasonably accurate data. One acceptable method is a properly controlled system of post-enrollment self-identification by students. If a self-identification method is utilized, a verification procedure to ascertain the completeness and accuracy of student submissions should also be employed where feasible. In order to provide reasonably accurate data, the institution may require students to complete a questionnaire and/or identify themselves by name or otherwise when providing information. The fact that the information is being gathered in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 may be disseminated in the manner and to the extent that the institution deems appropriate.

- 7. CHECKING. Parts B and C of the form are designed to simplify the checking to see that both the discipline specialties and the racial/ethnic categories add to the total for a division. By adding down the specialty lines and up the racial/ethnic lines, both should result in the same division totals. Please be sure that these additions are verified prior to returning the form. This will reduce the need for this office to ask for clarification later.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PART A: FIRST-PROFESSIONAL DEGREES CONFERRED IN SELECTED FIELDS, 1976-77

Only the 10 professions listed below should be reported in Part A. Within these professions, report first-professional degrees only. A first-professional degree is defined herein as one which meets all three of the following criteria:

(1) it signifies completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) it is based on a program which requires at least 2 years of college work prior to entrance; and (3) a total of at least 6 academic years of college work is required to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional curriculum itself.

The "Other" category is to be used only in the event that there are first-professional degrees within the 10 professions other than those specifically named in connection with those professions.

For each of the 10 disciplines, degrees other than first-professional are to be reported in Part B.

The TOTAL line (line 14) should show the sums of the entries in each discipline in columns 4 and 5.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PART B: BACHELOR'S, MASTER'S, AND DOCTOR'S DEGREES

1. TYPES OF DEGREES. Report earned bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees, except for those first-professional degrees reported in Part A. Report certificates and diplomas if they are equivalent to a bachelor's degree and if they are based on at least 4 years of college work.

Do not report honorary degrees.

Certificates for work between the master's degree and the doctor's degree should be separately listed at the end of Part B. See 5(d) below.

(Report Associate in Arts degrees or similar awards below the bachelor's level in Part C.)

2. GROUPING OF DISCIPLINES. The major fields of study to be reported here fall in the following discipline divisions:

Except for the Master of Divinity degree (Part A), report all master's degrees in Part B, Columns (6) and (7) (even though the master's is required in some fields, such as Library Science, Hospital Administration, and Social Work, for employment at the professional level, and even though, as in the case of Social Work, 4 years of undergraduate work are required for entrance into the program and an additional 2 years for completion.) Report Education specialist (6-year degree) in same columns as master's degrees, in appropriate discipline specialty in Education (0800).

- (c) DOCTORATE. The doctorate classification includes such degrees as Doctor of Education, Doctor of Juridical Science, Doctor of Public Health, and the Ph.D. degree in any field whether Agronomy, Food Technology, Education, Engineering, Public Administration, Ophthalmology, Radiology, etc. (In the case of the Doctor of Public Health, the prior professional degree is generally earned in the closely related professional field of medicine or of sanitary engineering.) - (d) OTHER DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE. If your institution provides any recognition (degree or certificate) for a program intermediate between the master's degree and the doctor's degree (Ph.D., Ed.D., etc.) which in essence is the doctor's degree without the dissertation (for example, Master of Philosophy, Candidate-in Philosophy, etc.) (do not include 6-year specialist degrees), please report the name of the degree or certificate and the number of students receiving it in the item at the end of Part B (after Item No. 9800). 6. CLASSIFICATION OF DEGREES ACCORDING TO MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY

- (a) Specific Classification. Classify degrees as specifically as the list of specialties in the broad discipline divisions of the report form permits. - (e) Double majors. When a student graduates with a major in two discipline specialities, report the degree in the field in which the degree was awarded. If the student received two degrees, report only one—in the field of greater specialization, if possible.
- (f) Unlisted Fields of Study. When classifying a specialty which does not seem to fit into the list, the institution has two choices: (a) the specialty can be listed by name under "other" if it represents an

unlisted specialty, or (2) it can be placed in a "general" category if it covers several listed specialities. Do NOT erase or change any titles of discipline specialties.

Discipline specialties are coded by number. Keypunching is done according to code number and any manual name change would result in improper coding.

(g) General Majors. The term general major is used to designate diversified curriculums within an area of study. Ordinarily, degrees based on a general major should be reported in one of the general categories of the report-form, such as Physical sciences, general (1901); Social sicences, general (2201); Humanities and social sciences (4903), etc. Thus a degree based on concentration in History-Government-Economics should be reported in Social sciences, general.

- (h) Interdisciplinary Studies. The code in the 4900 group are for reporting fields of study which represent two or more broad discipline divisions; for example, Mass Communications, encompassing segments of psychology, education, business, journalism, social sciences, fine arts, etc., should be reported there. Specify the name of the interdisciplinary study when reporting in 4999.
- (i) Before submission, please verify that the specialty subtotals (for examples, lines 22, 33, and 52, etc.) are the sum of the specified preceding lines for every column (colums (4) through (9).
- (j) No data should be entered in gray areas, such as that for code number 0899 on page 22.

Part C consists of 3 sections, as follows:

Section 1: Arts and science or general programs, NOT organized as occupational curriculums

Section 2: Science-related or engineering-related organized occupational curriculums, subdivided by subject field designation

Section 3: Nonscience-related and nonengineering-related organized occupational curriculums, subdivided by subject field designation

Each student's curriculum is to be reported in the ONE section where it best fits. If a student has received both an associate degree and a certificate for the same 2-year curriculum, the completion is to be counted just once. A combination curriculum which includes both general courses and occupational courses should be reported in section 2 or 3 if it meets all the criteria of an organized occupational curriculum (see below): otherwise it would be reported in section 1. In all sections, report whole curriculums only—not individual courses.

For purposes of this survey, an organized occupational curriculum is one which meets all four of the following criteria:

- A. High school graduation or equivalent, but no work beyond high school, is required for admission to the curriculum.
- B. The curriculum is a series of required and elective courses constituting an integrated program designed to prepare students for IMMEDIATE employment in a SPECIFIC occupation or cluster of occupations. A group of courses, even when all of them are in a given subject area, do not necessarily constitute an organized curriculum.
- C. Completion of the curriculum requires at least one but less than four years of full-time attendance, or the equivalent in part-time attendance over a longer period. A "year" means an academic year of approximately nine months.

D. The curriculum leads to ANY type of formal recognition (certificate, associate degree, diploma, a transscript recognizing successful completion, a statement of completion from an administrator of the institution, or other FORMAL recognition) signifying that the student has completed an organized curriculum; or the State grants a license or other formal recognition, upon examination, to all graduates of the curriculum.

Note that, for purposes of this survey, organized occupational programs are NOT designed as the equivalent of the first one, two, or three years of a baccalaureate degree program.

Example: Pre-engineering is NOT an organized occupational curriculum as defined in this survey, because it is designed to prepare students for CONTINUATION in the regular engineering program for the bachelor's degree. If an associate degree was awarded for this program, it should be reported in Section 1, columns 4-5. If no associate degree was awarded. it should be excluded from this survey altogether.

Engineering technology IS an organized occupational curriculum, as defined in this survey, because it is designed to prepare students for immediate employment upon completion. It should be reported in Section 2.
