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UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT OMAHA

ROLE AND MISSION

As defined by the State of Nebraska, the object of the University of Nebraska is "to afford to the inhabitants of this state the means of acquiring a thorough knowledge of the various branches of literature, science and arts." The University of Nebraska at Omaha has the specific responsibilities of "operating general programs of undergraduate instruction and programs of graduate instruction, research, and public service" pursuant to its legislatively assigned role and mission. 2

The University of Nebraska at Omaha, Nebraska's metropolitan university, has primary responsibility within the state for the operation of urban-oriented programs that carry out this mission of teaching, research, and service. 3 The University also has the responsibility of operating the Nebraska Business Development Center, a cooperative program of the UNO College of Business Administration and the United States Small Business Administration that provides small business development services through a series of centers throughout Nebraska. 4

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The University of Nebraska at Omaha is a comprehensive, public university located in the heart of Nebraska's largest city. It is the second-largest higher education campus in the state. UNO is part of the University of Nebraska system, which also includes the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha, with approximately 500 full-time faculty members, offers academic programs, including 130 undergraduate degree and certificate programs and 70 graduate degree and certificate programs. Undergraduate degree programs are offered in the colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Communication, Fine Arts & Media, Information Science and Technology, Public Affairs and Community Service, and the Division of Continuing Studies. Programs and courses also are offered in the Colleges of Human Resources and Family Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Agriculture and Natural Resources, and Architecture, which are

administered by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. UNO administers the College of Public Affairs and Community Service on both the Omaha and Lincoln campuses.

With a student body of over 15,000 undergraduate and graduate students, the University focus on students is the top strategic goal. The UNO student population is a diverse mix of full and part-time students, and traditional and non-traditional age enrollees. Students come from all walks of life, including traditional students who live on or off-campus, part-time students, working professionals, and international students. The broad backgrounds and varied experiences of the UNO student population enrich learning. Ample opportunity is provided for specialized study in terms of interest, talent and ultimate vocational objective. The University works to ensure that its graduates be good citizens who earn a better living and live a richer, fuller life.

The University, in addition to offering courses for traditional college credit, offers college credit to talented high school students in the UNO dual enrollment program, designs training courses for thousands of business and industrial employees; provides in-service training for elementary and secondary school teachers; is a leader in quality distance education instruction and sponsors a wide variety of conferences, workshops, lectures, and fine art events to enrich the college credit offerings.

Opportunities for teaching and research abroad, coordinated by the Office of International Studies and Programs, exist through the University's network of sibling institutions in Afghanistan, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzogovenia, Canada, China, Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Greece, India, Japan, Latvia, Lithuania, Mexico, Moldova, Nicaragua, Norway, Philippines, Romania, Russia, South Korea, Tajikistan, the Ukraine, United Kingdom and other countries.

HISTORY

The University of Nebraska at Omaha had its beginnings in the University of Omaha, a private college established in 1908. The University of Omaha, a co-educational institution affiliated with the Presbyterian Theological Seminary at Omaha, admitted its first twenty-six students for the Fall 1909 semester under the leadership of founding president Dr. Daniel E. Jenkins. The University grew swiftly, with the original twenty-six students growing to approximately a thousand by 1929.

Between 1918 and 1933, the number of municipal universities in the United States expanded from twenty-three to 167, and the University of Omaha was part of this trend. In May 1930, the people of Omaha voted to accept the University as a city institution, and the Regents of the Municipal University of Omaha, appointed by the Omaha Board of Education, assumed control of the institution in January 1931. As enrollment and library holdings continued to grow, new facilities became necessary. In November 1936, the University obtained a New Deal grant from the Public Works Administration to aid in the construction of a new campus at 60th and Dodge Streets. What is now Arts and Sciences Hall opened for summer classes in 1938.7

The University experienced another major transformation in 1968 with its integration into the University of Nebraska, accomplished with the overwhelming support of students and citizens. The Municipal University of Omaha had 8,730 students in the fall of 1967; by 1970, the University of Nebraska at Omaha had a fall enrollment of 13,185.

The University of Nebraska at Omaha's growth has continued. The Peter Kiewit Institute, the first building on the Pacific Street Campus, opened in 1999 to house UNO's College of Information Science and Technology and the Omaha programs of the University of Nebraska–Lincoln's College of Engineering and Technology. The first student housing at UNO also opened in 1999; student housing has since expanded to provide over 1,600 beds, allowing a tenth of the student body to live on campus. As of

January 22, 2010, the campus is planning construction of another student housing facility on the Pacific Street site near the Scott Conference Center. Mammel Hall, the new home of the College of Business Administration was dedicated October, 2010. The Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building renovation was dedicated October, 2010. The Welcome Center was dedicated August, 2010.

As of the Fall 2010 semester, enrollment had grown to 15,448. Facilities have expanded from a single building on one campus in 1938 to over forty buildings administered by the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Capital projects currently underway include:

- Sports fields
- Renovation of Roskens Hall to house the College of Education started August 2010 and will be completed August 2011
- The Community Engagement Center facility is in planning stages
- Development of the Center Street Campus
- Planning and construction of additional Student Housing on Pacific Street Campus.

Starting October 8, 2008, UNO held a year-long celebration of its centennial, reflecting upon its first century of growth and transformation, and beginning in 2009, the College of Arts and Sciences is celebrating a hundred years of excellence in liberal arts education. Through the support of the State of Nebraska, the City of Omaha, and donors, the University of Nebraska at Omaha will continue its strong traditions of student focus, academic excellence, and community engagement into its second century.

Figure 1: Administrative-Site Head Count Enrollment Fall 2001 through Fall 2010



Figure 2: Administrative-Site FTE Enrollment, By Student Level: Fall Semesters, 1999 through Fall 2010






Figure 4: Delivery-Site Head Count Enrollment Fall 2001 through Fall 2010






Figure 7: Delivery-Site Enrollment by Gender Fall 2007 through Fall 2010




Figure 8: Delivery-Site Enrollment by Full-Time and Part-Time Fall 2006 through Fall 2010




Figure 9: Delivery-Site Head Count Enrollment Spring 2002 through Spring 2010




Figure 11: Delivery-Site Head Count Enrollment by Minority Ethnic Origin Spring 2010




Figure 13: Delivery-Site Enrollment by Full-time and Part-time Spring 2006 through Spring 2010

Figure 15: Degrees Conferred by Level Academic Year 2005-2006 through Academic Year 2009-2010



Figure 17: University of Nebraska at Omaha Residence of Alumni Total: 69,802



The University of Nebraska at Omaha Libraries consist of the Dr. C.C. and Mabel L. Criss Library and the KANEKO-UNO Library.

The newly renovated Criss Library offers innovative services and facilities in addition to traditional academic research and study materials. The collection includes-approximately 725,000 books, 65,000 journal titles, over 2,000,000 microforms, and 11,000 pieces of audiovisual material. The library also houses the University Archives, the Arthur Paul Afghanistan Collection, Senator Chuck Hagel papers, and as a government documents depository, the Criss Library collects many federal and Nebraska state publications. Nearly all of the Library's collection is on open shelves and is arranged according to the Library of Congress classification system. The holdings of the Library are available online through the Library Catalog and numerous electronic databases.

The KANEKO-UNO Library, located within The KANEKO at 12th and Jones Street in Omaha's Old Market, is a unique space for study, research, and investigation that seeks to inspire people to expand their awareness and knowledge in an atmosphere of flexible learning and creativity. The current 900-title collection is based around the theme of "creativity." The K-UNO library is equipped with state-of-the-art video conferencing equipment, high definition monitors, blu-ray dvd, and other computing equipment.

Facilities Development Plan 2006-2015 Overview [excerpts]

As a metropolitan university of distinction, the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) is an invaluable higher education resource in the Omaha community and the State of Nebraska. Guided by its strategic goals of 1) focusing on students, 2) academic excellence and 3) community engagement, UNO is proud to be the institution of first choice for the majority of its ever increasing freshmen classes. The Guinter Kahn Addition to the Criss Library, the College of Public Affairs and Community Service (CPACS) Building project, and continued development of the Pacific and Center properties will offer exciting new growth opportunities to this dynamic institution.

Student housing, including the planned addition of 400 beds during the 2007/08 academic year, serves as a catalyst to develop a strong sense of community among students. Those residing on campus have increased utilization of existing facilities, a trend that will continue as residential housing is added incrementally. UNO is rapidly evolving into a 24-hour campus, serving both residential and commuter students with a variety of activities and amenities.

Celebrating its centennial in 2008, the university's physical environment has expanded and transformed into an aesthetically beautiful campus. A central pedestrian walkway unites the Dodge location's mix of traditional and contemporary academic buildings constructed of brick and limestone. These facilities are nestled into a thoughtful, inviting and sophisticated metropolitan landscape, creating a strong sense of place within the Omaha community.

The recent addition of the Center property bordering Papio Creak is a tremendous opportunity for UNO to expand campus services and enhance university outreach. Placing UNO on another major east/west Omaha circulator, this land offers great growth potential well into the future. As this property and the Pacific property develop, care should be taken to reinforce and complement the sense of place that exists at the Dodge location.

The private development of Aksarben Village between the Pacific and Center properties, will feature an eclectic mix of shops, offices and private housing units. This will help unite UNO's southern-most location, offering both those residing on, and commuting to, all three locations, increased access to entertainment, shopping and services. Building on the high standards of previous campus plans, the university is well-positioned to continue its advance guided by this Facilities Development Plan.
