DEFINITIONS

MULTI-CAMPUS INSTITUTION. An organization bearing a resemblance to an institutional system, but unequivocally designated as a single institution with either of two organizational structures: (1) an institution having two or more campuses responsible to a central administration (which central administration may or may not be located on one of the administratively equal campuses) or (2) an institution having a main campus with one or more branch campuses attached to it.

MAIN CAMPUS. In those institutions comprised of a main campus and one or more branch campuses, the main campus (sometimes called the parent institution) is usually the location of the core, primary, or most comprehensive program. Unless the institution-wide or central administrative office for such institutions is reported to be at a different location, the main campus is also the location of the central administrative office.

BRANCH CAMPUS. A campus of an institution of higher education which is organized on a relatively permanent basis (i.e., has a relatively permanent administration), which offers an organized program or programs of work of at least 2 years (as opposed to courses), and which is located in a community different from that in which its parent institution is located. To be considered in a community different from that of the parent institution, a branch shall be located beyond a reasonable commuting distance from the main campus of the parent institution.

INSTITUTIONAL SYSTEM. A complex of two or more institutions of higher education, each separately organized or independently complete, under the control or supervision of a single administrative body.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

This survey constitutes an integral part of the comprehensive nation-wide system of basic data on higher education – the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) – collected by NCES. As such it collects and reports basic data widely used by administrators, planners, researchers, and guidance counselors.

This form of this survey has had only three additions since 1970-71. The discipline specialties of Pharmach (D. Phar. degree) and Chiropractic (D.C. or D.C.M.degrees) were added to the Part A: First-Professional Degrees in 1975-76, as a result of a significant increase in the number of institutions that had added these discipline specialties under the "Other" category. The racial/ethnic data also were included for the first time in 1975-76 at the request of the Office for Civil Rights. The form for 1978-79 is identical to that used for each year from 1975-76 to the present, except that last year the racial/ethnic data areas were lightly shaded to indicate that the racial/ethnic data are requested on an alternate year cycle, and were not collected on this form last year. The racial/ethnic data are being required on this form this year.

REDUCTION OF PAPERWORK BURDEN

HEGIS has reduced the paperwork burden on the respondents in higher education by providing ONE nation-wide system of basic data with standard terminology and definitions that ALL national, regional, State, and local agencies and associations can use, eliminating the necessity for each of them to collect this information. Recent legislation has increased the amount of data requested on this form; in order to reduce the burden on reporting institutions by eliminating the considerable duplication of effort that otherwise would have been required by reporting to two separate agencies, the racial/ethnic data required by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) have been added to this form on alternate years, and are supplied to OCR by NCES.

MANDATORY VERSUS VOLUNTARY REPORTING

Mandatory Reporting. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requires that services and benefits provided by recipients of Federal financial assistance be offered without regard to race, color, or national origin. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 requires that, with certain exceptions, the services and benefits of federally assisted educational programs and activities be offered without discrimination on the basis of sex. This report is one indicator utilized by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) in carrying out its responsibilities to verify compliance with Title VI and Title IX.

This report is to be completed in its entirety by all institutions of higher education that receive, are applicants for, or expect to be applicants for Federal financial assistance as defined in the HEW Regulation implementing Title VI (45 CFR 80.13), or as defined in any HEW Regulation implementing Title IX. If your institution does not fall into any of these categories, please inform us of this fact.

Section 80.6(b) of the Regulation implementing Title VI (*a portion of which is set forth below*) and similar provisions of the Title VI Regulations of other Federal agencies, authorize collection of this information.

Each recipient shall keep such records and submit to the responsible Department official or his designee timely, complete and accurate compliance reports at such times, and in such form and containing such information, as the responsible Department official or his designee may determine to be necessary to enable him to ascertain whether the recipient has complied or is complying with this part."

Voluntary Reporting. Those institutions to which these regulations do not apply are not required to complete this questionnaire, which is authorized by law (P.L. 93-380). However, it is hoped that institutions not subject to the provisions of Title VI and Title IX will voluntarily complete all portions of the survey (*or at least all except the racial/ethnic data portions*) as they have done in the past. Doing so will enable the Nation-

al Center for Education Statistics (NCES) to continue to publish complete data on earned degrees for the Nation, the States, and individual institutions.

RECORD KEEPING

As part of an order in the Adams vs. Califano litigation entered against the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare in December 1977, the Office of the Secretary of this Department must advise institutions receiving Federal financial assistance that they are required to keep copies of completed surveys on file and make them available to the public on request. (*Order, December 29, 1977, K. 28. at p. 20-21*).

It has been determined that the Degrees and Other Formal Awards Conferred Between July 1, 1978 and June 30, 1979 falls under the order's requirement for retention of copies and public release of data if requested. Other surveys that are part of the enclosed Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) package are not subject to the above stipulations because they do not contain information required by the Office for Civil Rights.

SURVEY COVERAGE

1. **INCLUSIVE DATES.** Report only those degrees (*including awards in Part C*) which were actually conferred between July 1, 1978, and June 30, 1979. Degrees earned but not yet conferred during this time period should be reported in next year's survey.

2. **INSTITUTIONAL COVERAGE.** A separate report is requested from each branch or member of a system, as well as from each entirely independent institution and each "parent" institution. Please provide the information requested in item 6 on the cover page, which is intended to permit complete identification of the reporting unit. Do not include degrees conferred by branches of your institution located in foreign countries.

6. **RACIAL/ETHNIC DATA.** In part A the number of graduates in each first-professional field should be shown by racial/ethnic category. In Parts B and C racial/ethnic summaries are requested for each discipline division. The definitions for these categories are:

Non-resident alien. A person who is not a citizen of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Resident aliens, non-citizens who have been lawfully admitted for permanent residence (*and who hold a "green card"—Form I-151*), are to be reported in the appropriate racial/ethnic categories along with United States citizens.

Non-resident aliens are to be reported separately, on the lines provided, rather than in any of the five racial/ethnic categories which follow.

Black, non-Hispanic. A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (*except those of Hispanic origin*).

American Indian or Alaskan Native. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Sub-continent, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, and Samoa.

Hispanic. A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, non-Hispanic. A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (*except those of Hispanic origin*).

Racial/ethnic designations as used in this survey do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. For the purpose of this report, a student may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded in the community as belonging. However, no person may be counted in more than one racial/ethnic group.

The manner of collecting the racial/ethnic information is left to the discretion of the institution, provided that the system which is established results in reasonably accurate data. One acceptable method is a properly controlled system of post-enrollment self-identification by students. If a self-identification method is utilized, a verification procedure to ascertain the completeness and accuracy of student submissions should also be employed where feasible. In order to provide reasonably accurate data, the institution may require students to complete a questionnaire and/or identify themselves by name or otherwise when providing information. The fact that the information is being gathered in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 may be disseminated in the manner and to the extent that the institution deems appropriate.

7. **CHECKING.** Parts B and C of the form are designed to simplify the checking to see that both the discipline specialties and the racial/ethnic categories add to the total for a division. By adding down the specialty lines and up the racial/ethnic lines, both should result in the same division totals. Please be sure that these additions are verified prior to returning the form. This will reduce the need for this office to ask for clarification later.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PART A: FIRST-PROFESSIONAL DEGREES CONFERRED IN SELECTED FIELDS, 1978-79

Only the 10 professions listed below should be reported in Part A. Within these professions, report first-professional degrees only. A first-professional degree is defined herein as one which meets all three of the following criteria:

(1) it signifies completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) it is based on a program which requires at least 2 years of college work prior to entrance; and (3) a total of at least 6 academic years of college work is required to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional curriculum itself.

The "Other" category is to be used only in the event that there are first-professional degrees within the 10 professions other than those specifically named in connection with those professions.

For each of the 10 disciplines, degrees other than first-professional are to be reported in Part B.

The TOTAL line (line 14) should show the sums of the entries in each discipline in columns 4 and 5.

(c) DOCTORATE. Please report the doctor's degrees (except those included in Part A) in Columns (8) and (9) of the report-form.

(d) INTERMEDIATE DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE. If your institution provides any recognition (degree or certificate) for a program intermediate between the master's degree and the doctor's degree (Ph.D., Ed.D., etc) which in essence is the doctor's degree without the dissertation (for example, Master of Philosophy, Candidate-in-Philosophy, etc.) (do not include 6-year specialist degrees), please report the name of the degree or certificate and the number of students receiving it in the item at the end of Part B (after Item No. 9800). (Do not include in the tabulated figures for Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctor's degrees in the report form.)

6. CLASSIFICATION OF DEGREES ACCORDING TO MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY

(a) Specific Classification. Classify degrees as specifically as the list of specialties in the broad discipline divisions of the report form permits. Thus, report a bachelor's degree in business administration with an accounting major in Accounting (0502), NOT in Business and commerce, general (0501).

(b) Degree of Doctor of Philosophy. Classify the Doctor of Philosophy degree according to the student's major field of study. Thus, a Ph.D. in Chemistry should be reported as a degree in Chemistry, NOT as one in Philosophy.

(c) Majors of Students Prepared to Teach. The general rule is to classify degrees according to the major area of specialization. This means, in general, that degrees of students who have prepared to teach an academic subject, such as English, biology, or foreign languages, should be reported respectively in Letters, Biological Sciences, and Foreign Languages and NOT in Education. On the other hand, the degrees of students who have prepared to teach such special subjects as agriculture, art, music, etc. should be reported in Agricultural education (0899-1, Art education (0831), and Music education (0832).

(d) Split major. When a student graduates with a split major, report the degree in the area of greater specialization, if possible. If this is not possible, the degree should be reported in the discipline specialty closest to the combination. If a split major involves two languages, report it in 1101, Foreign languages, general. Similarly, within each of the other discipline divisions, if a split major involves two specialties within a division, the degree should be reported under the appropriate "general" specialty indicated under that discipline heading. For example, a major in history and political science should be reported under 2201, Social sciences, general. If the split major covers more than one discipline division, the degree should be reported in the area of greater specialization. DO NOT REPORT FRACTIONS OF A DEGREE.

(e) Double majors. When a student graduates with a major in two discipline specialties, report the degree in the field in which the degree was awarded. If the student received two degrees, report only one—in the field of greater specialization, if possible.

(f) Unlisted Fields of Study. When classifying a specialty which does not seem to fit into the list, the institution has two choices: (a) the specialty can be listed by name under "other" if it represents an

unlisted specialty, or (2) it can be placed in a "general" category if it covers several listed specialties. Do NOT erase or change any titles of discipline specialties.

Discipline specialties are coded by number. Key punching is done according to code number and any manual name change would result in improper coding.

(g) **General Majors.** The term general major is used to designate diversified curriculums within an area of study. Ordinarily, degrees based on a general major should be reported in one of the general categories of the report-form, such as Physical sciences, general (1901); Social sciences, general (2201); Humanities and social sciences (4903), etc. Thus a degree based on concentration in History-Government-Economics should be reported in Social sciences, general.

(h) **Interdisciplinary Studies.** The codes in the 4900 group are for reporting fields of study which represent two or more broad discipline divisions; for example, Mass Communications, encompassing segments of psychology, education, business, journalism, social sciences, fine arts, etc., should be reported there. Specify the name of the interdisciplinary study when reporting in 4999.

(i) **Before submission, please verify that the specialty subtotals (for examples, lines 22, 33, and 52, etc.) are the sum of the specified preceding lines for every column (column (4) through (9).**

(j) No data should be entered in gray areas, such as that for code number 0899 on page 23 and code numbers 1205, 1207, 1216-2, and 1219 on page 28.
