ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of university officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

UNIVERSITY HONORS PROGRAM

The University Honors Program is an all-university program which provides maximum educational opportunities for students of high ability through special multidisciplinary seminars and participation in an academic level not generally possible in usual curricular offerings.

The program is an outgrowth of the Arts and Sciences Honors program and was initiated in 1978. It is governed through the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and administered through the Honors coordinator. UNOmaha colleges which implement honors programs include Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts, and Public Affairs and Community Service.

As part of their Honors Program requirements, students undertake a research project that results in a senior honors thesis. Students and their theses topics are listed at the end of the list of graduates. Students who have been designated in this booklet as Honors Program students have fulfilled the academic requirements of this program.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

PAUL A. VOLCKER

Paul A. Volcker, professor emeritus of international economic policy at Princeton University and the former Henry Kaufman Visiting Professor at New York University's Stern Business School, will deliver today's commencement address. He also will receive an honorary Doctor of Philosophy degree.

Mr. Volcker was born in Cape May, New Jersey, in 1927. He earned his B.A. from Princeton University in 1949 and his M.A. in political economy and government from the Harvard University Graduate School of Public Administration in 1951. The following year, he attended the London School of Economics as a postgraduate student.

Mr. Volcker has worked with the federal branch of the government for almost three decades, serving in high office under five U.S. presidents. Before becoming chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in 1979, Mr. Volcker spent more than four years as president of the New York Federal Reserve Bank - the principal operating arm of the system. He also had two tours of duty as an official of the U.S. Treasury, serving as Under Secretary for Monetary Affairs from 1969 to 1974. In that position, Mr. Volcker was responsible for developing and implementing treasury debt management and federal credit policies. On behalf of the United States, Mr. Volcker conducted international monetary negotiations during the transition from the Bretton Woods fixed exchange rate system to the floating rate system. In the area of domestic finance, he initiated the auctioning of treasury bonds.

In 1987, Mr. Volcker was asked to chair the National Commission on the Public Service, which became known as the Volcker Commission. The organization was charged with building public awareness of the contribution of the career services to government and to encourage excellence in government and in legislative, educational and administrative measures supportive of excellence in government.

In 1996, Mr. Volcker chaired an international panel charged with investigating the assets of Holocaust victims in Switzerland. The panel, which concluded its audit on Dec. 6, found records of 54,000 accounts that were probably linked to victims of Nazi persecution.

It is with great pleasure that today's commencement speaker, Paul A. Volcker, is awarded the honorary Doctor of Philosophy degree from UNOmaha - a dedicated public servant whose visionary leadership, coupled with his economic and political expertise, has made a true difference in modern society.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT

RICHARD COLLINS

A 1965 UNOmaha graduate and now a cardiologist, Dr. Richard Collins is Medical Director of Immanuel Health Systems and Director of the Heart Disease Prevention and Reversal Program for Alegent Health. He also is the medical director of the Dean Ornish Program. However, he may be better known as the "Cooking Cardiologist," the title of his local television show that airs Sunday mornings on WOWT-Channel 6.

The show provides a forum for Collins in his fight against heart disease. He presents the latest information on heart disease and offers recipes, many of them his own. In November, Collins appeared on a November edition of the "Regis and Kathie Lee" show, on which he prepared a low-fat dessert for a national TV audience.

While in New York for the show Collins also received a "Freddie" award sponsored by the American Medical Association and Time Incorporated. The award was in honor of the recent documentary he produced on soy-healthy cooking.

Awards are nothing new to Collins. He's also received the Spirit of Immanuel Award, presented by the Immanuel Charitable Foundation in recognition of his long-standing dedication to Immanuel Medical Center. He is the first physician to receive that award, the highest honor bestowed upon individuals "who have exemplified the Spirit of Immanuel through their actions, their words, their deeds and their unwavering commitment to Immanuel and those who are served."

An Omaha native, Collins graduated from North High School prior to attending then Omaha University. After receiving his bachelor's degree from OU he earned a degree from the University of Nebraska College of Medicine (1968), then a master's degree in biomedical engineering from Drexel University (1971). He completed graduate school for internal medicine at the Mayor Clinic in Rochester, Minn., (1976) and fulfilled his cardiology fellowship at the Mayo Clinic (1978).

Also a one-time Navy physician, Collins has written a book, "Recipes from the Cooking Cardiologist," now in its second edition. Humor is an integral part of his practice. He even has been known to take the stage as a comedian, appearing at the Funny Bone Comedy Club and other venues.

The Citation for Alumnus Achievement is presented each year at spring, summer and winter commencements to graduates who have achieved distinction in their careers. Since the Citation's inception 50 years ago the UNOmaha Alumni Association has honored more than 100 UNOmaha graduates with the award. The impressive list includes United States senators, military leaders, educators, artists, businessmen and women, entrepreneurs and many others who represent the best of UNOmaha graduates.

ORDER OF THE TOWER

HERMAN CAIN

Herman Cain is a leader who knows what it takes to turn dreams into reality. As true leaders often do, he shares this knowledge with others so they, in turn, can achieve their own dreams.

Cain, the December 1999 Order of the Tower recipient, is chief executive officer and president of Digital Restaurant Solutions, a Connecticut-based software technology company. He also serves as chairman of Godfather's Pizza Inc. (GPI), and as chief executive officer of T.H.E. Inc., a leadership consulting company.

A graduate of Morehouse College with a bachelor of science degree in mathematics, Cain earned his master's degree in computer science from Purdue University. Following employment with the U.S. Navy and Cola-Cola, he began his meteoric rise through the business ranks at The Pillsbury Company in 1977. After working for the Burger King Corporation - a Pillsbury subsidiary - Cain was appointed president of GPI, where he successfully led a group of senior management in purchasing the pizza chain from Pillsbury in 1988.

After serving as chairman of the board of directors of the National Restaurant Association (NRA) in 1994, Cain was asked in 1996 to lead the NRA as its full-time chief executive officer and president. During his tenure, he heightened the recognition of the restaurant industry to unprecedented levels.

In 1999, Cain and his wife, Gloria, established the Cain Leadership Program Fund at UNOmaha, which promotes leadership and scholarship in youth at the high school and college levels. The program awards scholarships to selected students who plan to attend UNOmaha and who exhibit leadership ability and academic performance throughout their high school careers. It also provides funding for the annual Herman Cain Leadership Day at UNOmaha.

Cain is the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including six honorary doctorate degrees and the Horatio Alger Award (1996). He is the author of two books, "Leadership Is Common Sense" and "Speak As A Leader," and was named one of Ebony magazine's 100 Most Influential Black Americans in 1997 and 1999.

For all his service and contributions to the university, it is with great pleasure that Herman Cain is awarded the Order of the Tower.

First presented in 1964, the Order of the Tower is the University of Nebraska at Omaha's highest non-academic award. It is bestowed upon community leaders whose service and/or financial support has made it possible for the university to address the academic, cultural and economic needs of the people of Omaha and the citizens of Nebraska. Recipients of the award embody virtues and attributes valued highly by the university and are recognized as an example to others.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL

B.J. REED, Ph.D.

B.J. Reed, Ph.D., functions in many capacities at UNOmaha - teacher, researcher, mentor, colleague, administrator, advocate. He embodies the essence of a metropolitan university by being "of" his community, not simply "in" it.

Dr. Reed joined the UNOmaha faculty in 1982 and has served as chairman of the Department of Public Administration since 1985. He received his bachelor of arts and master of science degrees in political science from Fort Hayes State University and his Ph.D. in political science from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

The honoree's leadership has been cited as an important factor in the growing national recognition of UNOmaha's Department of Public Administration. Dr. Reed serves as chair of the National Commission on Peer Review and Accreditation for public administration and public policy programs of the National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration (NASPAA). He recently received the Elmer Staats Career Public Service Award from NASPAA.

Dr. Reed oversees a number of community outreach initiatives at UNOmaha, including the Safe Futures Initiative, which addresses youth violence, and the Community Outreach Partnership Center, which focuses on building university-community partnerships to address urban problems. He also works closely with other community-based initiatives, including the Omaha Community Partnership, which addresses violence and drug use, and Neighborhood Builders, which provides leadership training for neighborhood associations in Omaha.

"His commitment to improving life in our city and state has enriched the academic careers of his students, the professional and service activities of his colleagues, and the lives of those in our community," a nominator wrote.

During the past two years, Dr. Reed also has provided the leadership for UNOmaha's strategic planning process.

In honor of his dedication and service, UNOmaha takes pride in recognizing Dr. B.J. Reed as the December 1999 recipient of the Chancellor's Medal.

The Chancellor's Medal at the University of Nebraska at Omaha was established to recognize the contributions of faculty and administrative staff who embody the institution's mission and values. It is bestowed only to those within the university community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.

STUDENT COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

TARA BUZZELL

Tara Buzzell understands the importance of balancing competing responsibilities. During her undergraduate career at UNOmaha, she excelled in the classroom, on the playing field and in her community as an active and concerned citizen. Her commencement address is titled "Not Just Trophies."

Buzzell graduates today magna cum laude with a bachelor of science degree in speech-language pathology. An Iowa native, she arrived at UNOmaha on a softball scholarship. During a three-year period, she compiled an overall pitching record of 47-13 and currently ranks 4th on the all-time Maverick record charts for pitching victories.

The honors bestowed upon Buzzell as both athlete and scholar are numerous. She was named the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Woman of the Year for the State of Nebraska in 1999, Female Student-Athlete of the Year in 1998-99, Most Outstanding Student-Athlete in 1999 and Most Outstanding Undergraduate in Speech-Language Pathology in 1999. She was the recipient of the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Award from 1996 to 1998, was named to the Dean's List at UNOmaha from 1996 to 1999 and was listed in the Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges in 1999.

In between her studies and practices at UNOmaha, Buzzell also made time to volunteer with a number of organizations, including Habitat for Humanity, Big Brothers/Big Sisters of the Midlands, the UNOmaha Student Leadership Council, the annual UNOmaha Diet Pepsi Women's Walk, the National Student Speech Language Hearing Association, and numerous sports camps, among others.

Buzzell will enter graduate school at UNOmaha in January. She will pursue a master of science degree in speech-language pathology. Ultimately, she plans to work in a rehabilitation setting that serves both children and adults.
