


Figure 5: Image of Ranganathan by Sarah is licensed under CC BY-NC 2.0. Retrieved from https://www.flickr.com/phot os/sarah_g/









Have a plan










Figure 7: Snippet of email newsletter Top Shelf Reference from *Booklist*.






Figure 17: Snippet view of Novelist Plus database.








Figure 20: Snippet of *Bookateria* web page from Publishers Lunch.


