DATA OF DATA

Fall enrollment traditionally is used to measure student access to postsecondary education and IPEDS will continue to provide this important statistical series. The Department also uses fall enrollment data in program planning and for setting funding allocation standard for legislatively controlled programs. Other Federal and State agencies use enrollment data in policymaking controlled programs. Other Federal and State agencies use enrollment data in policymaking decisions, economic and tinancial planning, manpower forecasting, and policy formulation.

The definitions and instructions for compiling IPEDS data have been designed to minimize comparability problems. However, postsecondary education institutions of data widely among themselves.
