ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

UNIVERSITY HONORS PROGRAM

The University Honors Program is an all-University program which provides maximum educational opportunities for students of high ability through special multidisciplinary seminars and participation in an academic level not generally possible in usual curricular offerings.

The program is an outgrowth of the Arts and Sciences Honors program and was initiated in 1978. It is governed through the office of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and administered through the Honors Coordinator. UNO colleges which implement honors programs include Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts, Public Affairs and Community Service, and Information Science and Technology.

As part of their Honors Program requirements, students undertake a research project that results in a Senior Honors Thesis. Students and their theses topics are listed at the end of the list of graduates. Students who have been designated in this booklet as Honors Program students have fulfilled the academic requirements of this program.

SARA ADKISSON

Sara Adkisson, a student from Ralston, Neb., has writing in her blood. She graduates today with a bachelor of fine arts degree in poetry from the Writer's Workshop in the College of Fine Arts. Her commencement address is titled "From Blossoms."

At UNOmaha, Adkisson received many honors including a Dean's Scholarship in the College of Fine Arts, and being named Undergraduate Major Honoree for the Writer's Workshop at the Honors Convocation last spring.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

PAULA K. GLISSMAN

Paula Glissman graduated from UNOmaha in 1981 with a bachelor's degree in business administration. Today, she is president and chief operating officer of Simmonds Restaurant Management Inc., an Omaha-based, privately-held corporation that owns and operates 72 Burger King and five Taco John's restaurants in Nebraska and Iowa.

Her start in the corporate world actually began in banking prior to graduation. In 1980, Glissman began working for FirstTier Bank, serving as a commercial banking officer through 1987. She managed a portfolio of 125 loan accounts totaling \$15 million. She was also the bank's designated liaison officer for the Small Business Administration (SBA).

Glissman later left FirstTier to work from her home, providing financial consulting and assisting SBA applicants. Her consulting included work for Simmonds Restaurant Management, where she performed debt restructuring and refinancing. She eventually joined the company full time, first as manager of special projects. She became chief financial officer in 1990 and vice president of development and finance in 1994 before assuming her current position as president and COO in 1998.

The 25-year-old company has grown to more than \$100 million in gross revenues and more than 4,000 employees. Glissman is responsible for acquisition negotiations, obtaining financing, real estate acquisition, lease negotiations, financial management, tax planning, accounting and marketing.

All along, she says, she has relied on what she learned while at UNOmaha.

"When I started at UNO, I signed up for whatever I wanted to," Glissman says. "I started as a business major, then flipped to fine arts, then liberal arts, back to business as an accounting major, then I switched to real estate, then to a finance major. What is amazing, is that almost everything I took at UNO I've been able to use and apply to my work here."

Glissman is married to fellow UNOmaha alum Gary Glissman. The couple has one son.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

CHARLES J. MARR

A Fremont, Neb., native, Charles J. Marr graduated from UNOmaha in 1977 as part of the university's first Executive MBA class. He also attended the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce at the University of Pennsylvania for three years, and earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1964.

Today, he is chief executive officer of Alegen Health, one of the largest integrated health care systems in the Midwest. Its four metropolitan medical centers, three rural hospitals and 38 primary care clinics in Nebraska and Iowa employ 7,500 people and serve more than 36,000 inpatients and 316,000 outpatients annually.

His professional life, though, began in another arena. Marr's first job after college was a two-month stint as field man for the Republican National Committee in North Dakota, working on behalf of Barry Goldwater. He later directed John E. Everroad's Nebraska campaign for lieutenant governor under Norbert Tiemann.

After working for two different advertising agencies, Marr entered the health care field in 1969 as the first public relations director for Nebraska Methodist Hospital. He had a variety of duties at Methodist and eventually become assistant administrator.

In 1980, he became president and chief executive officer of West Nebraska General Hospital in Scottsbluff. He stayed there until 1987, when he moved back to Omaha to serve as president and CEO of Immanuel Medical Center.

In 1996, Immanuel Health Systems merged with Bergan Mercy Health System to form Alegen Health, an entity with annual gross revenues exceeding \$1 billion. Alegen Health sees as part of its mission the care of poor and disadvantaged people, and provides more than \$40 million each year in community benefit programs.

"We are truly a faith-based system, sponsored by Lutherans and Catholics, with a common mission of caring for people," Marr says.

In 1994 Marr received the Distinguished Achievement Award from UNOmaha's College of Business Administration. Married with two daughters, he is active in the Omaha community, serving on nine area boards. As president of the Omaha Sister Cities Association he has assisted the developers of a city-run hospital in Jurmala, Latvia.

ORDER OF THE TOWER RECIPIENT

MARIAN IVERS

Marian Ivers has always been an overachiever. From her days as a student at Central High School to her re-entry into the workforce after a 14-year absence, this has been her secret.

Following high school, Ivers began her career as a secretary for General Electric. Then in 1962, following 14 years as a homemaker and mother, she returned to the workforce as an executive secretary for the Greater Omaha Chamber of Commerce. Over the course of her 27-year-career with the chamber, Ivers watched others closely and acquired as much knowledge as she could. She was the first woman on the American Chamber of Commerce Executives national board. In 1978, she was named executive vice president of the chamber - making her the organization's highest-ranking woman.

Following her retirement from the chamber in 1989, Ivers has continued her efforts to make Omaha a better place to live and work. While most of her effort is directed toward improving opportunities for women and girls, she also has great dedication to community betterment, building strong families, providing educational opportunities and supporting equal rights.

She has become well known on the UNOmaha campus for her 14-year involvement with the Women's Walk, and through her efforts to raise money for student athletes. Ivers is involved with many community organizations and serves on advisory committees for the Omaha Women's Fund, Campfire USA and Girls, Inc. She is also on the board of trustees for the Nebraska Shakespeare Festival. In March 2001, she was honored with the WomanSpirit Award from the Women's Fund of Greater Omaha.

Ivers has two daughters, Nancy Stocking and Laurie Pieper, and four grandchildren.

First presented in 1964, the Order of the Tower is the University of Nebraska at Omaha's highest non-academic award. Since that time, more than 70 individuals have received this honor, which symbolizes an ongoing commitment to the growth and development of the university.

The Order of the Tower is bestowed upon community leaders whose service and/or financial support has made it possible for the university to address the academic, cultural and economic needs of the people of Omaha and the citizens of Nebraska. Recipients of the award embody virtues and attributes valued highly by the university and are recognized as an example to others.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

ROBERT GRAHAM

Robert Graham, professor and chair of the physics department in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, is the latest recipient of the Chancellor's Medal.

Dr. Graham earned his B.A. in physics and mathematics at St. Cloud State University in 1963 and his B.S. in education in 1965. He earned his M.S. in science education and physics from UNOmaha in 1971, and his Ph.D. in physics education from the University of Nebraska - Lincoln in 1975.

Dr. Graham began his career in education as a high school physics and mathematics teacher in the Omaha area. He joined the physics faculty at UNOmaha in 1968, and he has been named chair of the department twice — from 1982-86 and 1994 to the present. Since coming to UNOmaha, Dr. Graham has received many awards and recognitions, including the UNOmaha College of Education Distinguished Alumni Award in 2001, and the Milo Bail Chair of Physics in 1997 and 2000.

In addition to his teaching duties at UNOmaha, Dr. Graham has taught in a number of community programs, including the Gifted Children's Program, Junior League and the Veterans in Education - Career Opportunities Program.

At UNOmaha, he has been instrumental in the creation of or active support of many UNOmaha Physics Department programs and outreach activities. Some of these include Aim for the Stars summer camps, the CAPOW (Chemistry And Physics On Wheels) program, the NASA Educators' Resource Center, Cooperative Reading Clubs, the Mallory Kountze Science Store, hands-on Durham atrium science displays, Mallory Kountze Planetarium star shows and Laser Majic-Rock shows. Through many of these programs, more than 50,000 K-12 students a year gain access to science education.

When he's not teaching or working with one of the many programs he created, Dr. Graham serves on a number of committees and organizations. He is a founding member of the Nebraska section of the American Association of Physics Teachers, and he serves on the National Science Teachers Association, the Nebraska K-12 state science curriculum committee and the UNOmaha Strategic Planning Steering Committee.

In honor of his service, professionalism and dedication, UNOmaha takes pride in recognizing Dr. Robert Graham as a December 2001 recipient of the Chancellor's Medal.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

DANIEL SULLIVAN

Daniel Sullivan, professor in the chemistry department in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, is the latest recipient of the Chancellor's Medal.

Dr. Sullivan earned his B.S. in secondary education from Northwest Missouri State University in 1958, his M.A. in general science from the University of Omaha in 1966, and his Ph.D. in biochemistry and nutrition from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1972.

Prior to joining the faculty at UNOmaha in 1962, Dr. Sullivan taught science classes in the Prescott and Anita, Iowa, school districts. Since coming to UNOmaha, he has received many awards for his teaching. In 1997 he was presented with the Excellence in Teaching Award and the Alumni Outstanding Teaching Award. Also in 1997, the Carnegie Foundation for Advancement of Teaching and Council for Advancement and Support of Education named him Nebraska Professor of the Year.

In addition to his teaching duties, Dr. Sullivan is the senior demonstrator for the CAPOW (Chemistry And Physics On Wheels) program. In this capacity, he spends much of his time bringing the wonders of chemistry and physics to students in schools throughout Nebraska and western Iowa. Since the program began in 1994, he has made more than 500 presentations. On a yearly basis, an average of 30,000 students view a CAPOW presentation.

When he's not teaching or presenting CAPOW demonstrations, Dr. Sullivan's research interests include neurochemistry, enzymology, science and the public, and science and safety for children. He is a member of the American Chemical Society, National Science Teachers Association, Council of Undergraduate Research, American Association of University Professors, Omicron Delta Kappa, and Toastmasters International. In addition, Dr. Sullivan serves on the Respiratory Care Review Board at Methodist College, the Project Banneker board, and he is Science Curriculum Adviser for Omaha Public Schools.

In honor of his professionalism, dedication and service, UNOmaha takes pride in recognizing Dr. Daniel Sullivan as a December 2001 recipient of the Chancellor's Medal.

**COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER
HONORARY DOCTORATE RECIPIENT**

HANS BRISCH

Hans Brisch's life has been highlighted by his many accomplishments as a scholar, professor and administrator. After immigrating to the United States from Germany as a teenager, Brisch supported himself through work, scholarships and loans to earn a high school diploma and college degree. He received his B.A. in political science from Park College in 1964, and his M.A. and Ph.D. in political science from the University of Kansas in 1967 and 1970, respectively.

Brisch began his career in the field of education as assistant director of the Public Affairs Institute at the University of Kansas. He went on to serve on the faculty of the University of Alabama, and in administrative positions with the Illinois Board of Higher Education, the University of Nebraska and the State of Nebraska Governor's Office.

In 1987, Brisch accepted the position of Chancellor of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. As Chancellor, he leads a State System comprised of 25 state colleges and universities, 10 constituent agencies, two higher education centers, and independent colleges and universities coordinated by the State System. Since assuming his role, Brisch has been credited with improving the system's competitiveness, program quality and faculty, while shifting the organization's focus to student success, excellence and efficiency.

Academic honors for Brisch include various fellowships and scholarships, including the Fulbright-Hays Fellow. In addition, he has been recognized with the National Humanity Award from the National Institute on Developmental Delays, the Oklahoma Administrator of the Year Award from the American Society for Public Administration, and the Chief Executive Leadership Award from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education.

Brisch also serves on numerous state, national education, and corporate boards and committees.
