2. Chancellors Update

Chancellor Christensen reviewed the recent CUMU conference where several UNO presentations took place. He shared thoughts about the future direction of the organization as it distinguishes itself from other institutions regarding the depth of community engagements. The CUMU Executive committee may fund a study to profile schools who identify community engagements as part of their core mission.

The Chancellor will be meeting with Jim Young and our capital campaign committee in the future regarding the community engagement center initiative. The Chancellor spoke of the upcoming special session of the legislature and the future budget cuts that may be asked of the university system. He thanked all committee members for their service and assured us of the importance of the committee's work especially going forward.

Neal shared a draft of the committee work on writing the Goal 3 sub-goals and objectives. The steering committee discussed process and format plans and will be asked to give input to the more complete draft at the Nov meeting.
