ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

The program is an outgrowth of the Arts and Sciences Honors program and was initiated in 1978. It is governed through the office of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and administered through the Honors Coordinator. UNO colleges which implement honors programs include Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts, Public Affairs and Community Service, and Information Science and Technology.

As part of their Honors Program requirements, students undertake a research project that results in a Senior Honors Thesis. Students and their thesis topics are listed at the end of the list of graduates. Students who have been designated in this booklet as Honors Program students have fulfilled the academic requirements of this program.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

JOHN FARR

John Farr has been pivotal to the advancement and reaccreditation of the University of Nebraska at Omaha. His leadership has been evident throughout the university and beyond. He currently is associate vice chancellor for academic affairs.

In 1969, he began his tenure with the university as an assistant professor of political science. Before being named to his current post in 1989, he served in a variety of positions, including associate professor of political science, assistant to the provost for program review and dean of the College of Continuing Studies.

A graduate of Texas Christian University, where he received both his B.A. (1959) and M.A. (1960), Farr went on to serve in the U.S. Army Military Police Corps as a first lieutenant. His assignments include being a commanding officer at the U.S. Army Sentry Dog Training School in Okinawa, Japan. In 1969, he earned his Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin.

At UNO, Farr has provided guidance on more than two-dozen university and intercampus committees. He played a major role in developing UNO's plan for assessing student academic achievement, role and mission statement and various long-range planning documents. His assistance also was key in the planning and execution of the UNO Aviation Institute.

Numerous awards have been presented to Farr in recognition of his outstanding abilities and dedication, including the UNO Chancellor's Medal and Otto F. Bauer Award for Distinguished Service. He also was recently honored as an invited participant at a national security forum at Air War College, located at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.

STUDENT COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

JOSHUA M. SAKALA

Joshua M. Sakala enjoys the field of biology and plans to become a clinical pharmacist. He is looking forward to furthering his education at the College of Pharmacy at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

Sakala, a Scottsbluff, Neb., native, will graduate with a bachelor of science in biotechnology. His commencement address is titled "Entering the Real World."

His studies at UNO included completing a variety of biotechnological research, which he said was an important learning experience enhanced by a wonderful mentor and lab staff.

He received many academic honors as a student, including the Rhoden, Barbara Hayhome Biology, CSI, Engel Sisters and Kenower Trust Scholarships; the Biotechnology Student of the Year Award; and consistently being named to the Chancellor's List and the Dean's List. Sakala also holds membership in Golden Key National Honour Society.

An avid runner, Sakala is currently training for the Omaha Marathon, which is set for September. Additionally, he enjoys watching movies, listening to music and playing guitar in his free time.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

ROBERT DANENHAUER

Bob Danenhauer is director of athletics at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. He served as assistant athletic director from the fall of 1995 to the summer of 1997, when he was named to his current post. Under his leadership, the university's programs, as well as its facilities, have experienced a number of improvements.

Division I ice hockey, women's swimming and diving, and women's soccer, tennis and golf are among the sports added to the UNO athletic program under Danenhauer's direction. He also helped the Mavericks acquire membership in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association and played an important role in the 1997-1998 expansion/renovation of the Sapp Fieldhouse.

Danenhauer received his bachelor of science degree from UNO in 1982 and an M.S. from Ft. Hays State University (Kan.) in 1993. While a student at UNO, he gained football honors as an All-North Central Conference defensive lineman and went on to play for the National Football League in Seattle and Buffalo (N.Y.).

Before joining the UNO staff, Danenhauer was athletic director and assistant principal at Millard South High School. He also spent time as head wrestling coach at Millard North High School and head football coach at Hays High School (Kan.).

As one of the founders of the Maverick Beef Club, Danenhauer served as the group's president until his assignment at UNO. He is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the College World Series Inc. Board.

The Chancellor's Medal at the University of Nebraska at Omaha was established to recognize the contributions of faculty and administrative staff who embody the institution's mission and values. It is bestowed only to those within the university community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.

ORDER OF THE TOWER

ELAINE SPIRE

Elaine Spire has been instrumental in developing and maintaining the legacy of the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Through extensive leadership and philanthropy, both she and her late husband, Robert, continue to support and promote the growth of the university.

An active community volunteer, Elaine has served on many commissions, community organizations and foundations, some of which include the Mayor's Commission on Human Rights, the Nebraska Humanities Foundation, the Appleseed Foundation and the Nebraska State Museum. Her activities also include membership in the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Sage Program, UNL Faculty Women's Club, the Heritage League, Nebraska Legislative League and the Lincoln Legal Auxiliary.

She received the inaugural Hubert Locke Award for Distinguished Service in 2002 for exemplary commitment to the ideals of public service.

Robert's contributions to the university and community are numerous, as well. A five-year member of the University of Omaha Board of Regents and a trustee of the University of Nebraska Foundation for 17 years, he was vital to the creation of the School of Public Affairs and Community Service in 1972 and helped see it through its transition to collegiate status a year later.

In 1995, the Robert M. Spire Development Fund was established in his memory, followed by the Robert M. Spire Chair in Music in 2000. The fund is available to students in the UNO College of Public Affairs and Community Service who display outstanding academic potential and meet designated financial standards. To date, more than 85 students have benefited from the fund, which covers tuition, books, rent and health care.

The Order of the Tower is UNO's highest non-academic award. It is bestowed upon community leaders whose service and/or financial support has made it possible for the university to address the academic, cultural and economic needs of the people of Omaha and citizens of Nebraska. Recipients of the award embody virtues and attributes valued highly by the university and are recognized as an example to others.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

RICHARD H. CHRISTIE

Richard H. Christie has been superintendent of schools for the Council Bluffs, Iowa, Community School District since 1988. He joined CBCSD in 1983 as executive director of human resources and staff development.

Christie is the first Alumnus Award Recipient to have earned a doctorate from UNO (Ed.D., 2003). He received a bachelor of arts degree from the University of South Dakota at Springfield in 1967 and an M.A. from the University of South Dakota at Vermillion in 1972.

Prior to his tenure at CBCSD, he was principal at two Iowa high schools for nine years. His 38-year career as an Iowa educator also includes stints as an assistant high school principal, teacher and coach.

As superintendent, Christie developed a systems approach to school improvement by aligning employee selection, induction and evaluation, as well as board and policy development, with budget, curriculum, professional and leadership development.

In 2001, he played a key role in the passing of a county wide, one-cent local option sales tax that is expected to raise \$60 million in 10 years for facilities improvements. The following year, he helped secure significant grant funding for universal preschool in all Pottawattamie County public school districts.

He was named the Area Education Agency 13 Superintendent of the Year in 1998 and Iowa Superintendent of the Year in 1999.

Aside from his CBCSD duties, Christie is an adjunct professor in the Department of Educational Administration and Supervision at UNO and works as an associate with two national consulting firms in the areas of executive and teacher selection. He also gives presentations at numerous state and national workshops, meetings and conferences.

Additionally, Christie has served on the boards and committees of various organizations, including the Greater Council Bluffs Chamber of Commerce, Christian Home Association/Children's Square USA, United Way of the Midlands, Iowa West Foundation, Horace Mann League, Iowa High School Athletic Association and Urban Education Network of Iowa.
