ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

UNO colleges which implement honors programs include Arts and Sciences; Business Administration; Education; Public Affairs and Community Service; Information Science and Technology; and Communication, Fine Arts and Media.

As part of their Honors Program requirements, students undertake a research project that results in a Senior Honors Thesis. Students and their theses topics are listed at the end of the list of graduates. Students who have been designated in this booklet as Honors Program students have fulfilled the academic requirements of this program.

In addition, she enjoyed representing the university as a tour guide for prospective new students and their parents.

In June, she was married to her husband, Drew, in a barefoot, sunset beach ceremony on an island off the coast of Florida. She enjoys knitting and reading in her free time.

Aspen Wild is interested in pursuing a career in public relations, training or event planning. She said she is excited to see which direction life takes her.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

MICHAEL DENNEY

Mike Denney has been head wrestling coach at the University of Nebraska at Omaha since 1979. One of the most respected wrestling coaches in the nation at any level, Denney is well known both on and off the mat for his dedication.

He recently led the Mavericks to three consecutive NCAA Division II national championships, and his 1991 team also won a national championship. The 2005-06 team also received the school's third National Dual Meet title.

Denney and the Mavericks have compiled a lengthy record of accomplishments during his tenure. UNO has posted 14 top-three finishes in the past 16 years and has not finished lower than eighth place since 1980. The Mavericks have garnered more top-10 finishes (26) than any other Division II school. The 2004-05 Mavericks were Academic National Champions, the first time a team has won both the academic and team championships in the same year.

Of the many students Denney has coached, 147 were Division II All-Americans, 24 were national champions, and three claimed Division I All-American honors. At least 60 of his former wrestlers now coach the sport, including the head coaches at sister institutions the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

A four-year starter in football and wrestling at Dakota Wesleyan University, Denney was an all-conference and all-district performer in both sports. He received a bachelor of arts degree from Dakota Wesleyan in 1969 and earned his master's degree in physical education from UNO in 1975.

Prior to joining UNO athletics, he coached at Omaha South and Omaha Bryan High Schools. Denney also played seven seasons as a lineman for the Omaha Mustangs semiprofessional football team. He is accomplished in martial arts and holds a third-degree black belt in Judo and Jujitsu. Denney has placed many years in the National Master Judo Championships and won the 1982 national championship at 209 pounds.

Denney is a frequent guest speaker and motivator of area youth. His team is also involved in a variety of community service projects, including promoting alcohol and drug-free messages to young people and providing clinics for young wrestlers and coaches.

Twice named the NCAA II Coach of the Year (1981 and 1991), Denney served on the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee for six years and is past president of the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches Association and past chairman of the Division II Wrestling Championships Committee. In 1988, he was inducted into the Dakota Wesleyan University Athletic Hall of Fame.

He also is a member of the NCAA Division II, Nebraska Wrestling and Metro Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame. In 2000, UNO recognized Denney's contributions by presenting him with the Chancellor's Medal.

ORDER OF THE TOWER RECIPIENT

MICHAEL MCLARNEY

Michael McLarney has been president and CEO of United Way of the Midlands since 1989. He joined UWM in 1973 as a campaign division director and has served in a number of capacities since that time, including senior vice president/chief of staff.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska at Omaha, McLarney has completed Executive Education Programs at Harvard Business School, the University of Michigan and the National Academy for Voluntarism. He is an elected member of the United Way National Professional Council and co-chairs the Mid-America Regional Council. Currently, he is a member of the United Way of America Public Policy Committee.

Additionally, he is a member of the steering committee for Omaha 2000 and serves on the Boards of the Omaha Community Partnership, the Omaha Job Clearinghouse, the National Conference for Community & Justice, the Non-Profit Association of the Midlands and the Dean's Advisory Committee for the UNO College of Public Affairs and Community Service.

An avid supporter of UNO, McLarney has actively engaged the campus community in the design and implementation of the research, policy and program development activities of UWM. Under his leadership, UNO faculty and researchers collaborated in the creation of a comprehensive report that is playing a key role in focusing culturally appropriate social and human services programming for Hispanic youth in the community.

Throughout his tenure, numerous UNO students have participated in UWM internship and volunteer activities, gaining valuable professional and community service opportunities. McLarney has also provided critical leadership and support in the development of the Neighborhood Center for Greater Omaha, a UNO-administrated program.

McLarney has been active on a number of professional committees, chaired the Mentoring Program for new United Way Chief Professional Officers and recently headed the Public Policy Task Force for the United Way of America Collaboration Project.

In the community, McLarney has played an active and visible role in organizations and issues that directly affect the welfare of local citizens. He has chaired the Advisory Committee for the Midlands Institute for Non-Profit Management and was instrumental in creating the Human Services Roundtable, serving as a member of its steering committee. He continues to be active on a number of local boards, committees and coalitions focusing on health and human service issues.

He is the recipient of the 1993 Outstanding Citizen Award from Woodmen of the World Alpha Lodge and the 1998 UNO Alumni Achievement Award.

The Order of the Tower is UNO's highest non-academic award. It is bestowed upon community leaders whose service and/or financial support has made it possible for the university to address the academic, cultural and economic needs of the people of Omaha and citizens of Nebraska. Recipients of the award embody virtues and attributes valued highly by the university and are recognized as an example to others.

CHANCELLOR'S MEDAL RECIPIENT

SHERI ROGERS

Sheri Rogers has been associate vice chancellor for academic affairs at the University of Nebraska at Omaha since 2004. She joined the Office of Academic Affairs in 2000 and has spent her entire academic career as an advocate for students and their learning.

Dr. Rogers began her tenure at UNO in 1994 as an assistant professor of teacher education in the College of Education. She was promoted to associate and full professor status in the Department of Teacher Education, the latter while assistant vice chancellor for academic affairs.

At UNO, she directs the Center for ePortfolio Based Assessment and campus accreditation. Dr. Rogers facilitates the Academic Quality Improvement Program task force leaders and oversees the myMAPP (Mapping Academic Performance through ePortfolios) initiatives. In addition, she coordinates PK-16 initiatives, including the Dual Enrollment Program and the Omaha Public Schools/UNO Early Entry Pilot.

She started her teaching career in 1981 as an English teacher at Decatur County Community School in Oberlin, Kan. Before arriving at UNO, Dr. Rogers was an instructor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

A product of the University of Nebraska, Dr. Rogers received her bachelor's degree in English and secondary education; her master's in literacy education and English; and a Ph.D. in administration, curriculum and instruction from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Her areas of specialization and interest are ePortfolio-based assessment, student-learning outcomes and literacy.

Dr. Rogers has been active on campus as a member of the UNO Strategic Planning Steering Committee and as the founder of the Metropolitan Omaha Educational Consortium (MOEC) Reading/Literacy Task Force. She is a founding member of the UNO Women of Color Awards Committee, a member of the Chancellor's Commission on Multicultural Affairs and was instrumental in the inauguration of the Black Executive Exchange Program (BEEP) at UNO in conjunction with the National Urban League.

She is a member of the Nebraska EPSCoR Diversity Steering Committee and the Omaha Chamber of Commerce's 21st Century Higher Education and Student Achievement Subcommittees, as well as the Youth Leadership Omaha Curriculum Committee. She is the state coordinator of the American Council on Education's (ACE) Nebraska Women in Higher Education Leadership Initiative, having planned and directed their statewide conference for the past two years.

Published extensively in numerous academic journals, Dr. Rogers has also co-authored two books and presented at many conferences across the nation. She was a member and officer of the Millard Board of Education from 1997 to 2003.

Her numerous honors include Student Education Association Teacher of the Year from UNL, four consecutive Recognition Awards for Contribution to Students from The Parents Association and The Teaching Council at UNL, and Millard Public Schools Foundation's Hall of Fame Community Booster Award. Dr. Rogers received the 2006 Del and Lou Ann Weber Award of Excellence and is a member of the 2006 class of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Millennium Leadership Institute Proteges.

The Chancellor's Medal at the University of Nebraska at Omaha was established to recognize the contribution of faculty and administrative staff who embody the institution's mission and values. It is bestowed only to those within the university community who have demonstrated unusual excellence.
