ACADEMIC REGALIA

Identification of the hood and robe as academic apparel is believed to have originated at the English universities of Oxford and Cambridge during the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The hoods are a carry-over from the times when monks, who operated these universities, wore them to protect their shaved heads in winter. The robe is an adaptation of the shoulder cape also worn by these same monks while collecting alms.

Use of the academic robe came to the United States in 1754 with the founding of what is now Columbia University. In 1895, a commission of University officials adopted a universal code of design and color for the academic garb. This code has undergone several revisions in subsequent years.

Styling of the robes varies for the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees with the width of sleeve borders and length of the hood increasing with each advanced degree. Hoods are normally not used for bachelor's degrees today. Instead, the tassel colors are used to indicate the degree program. All doctoral degree recipients are indicated by a gold tassel.

UNIVERSITY HONORS PROGRAM

STEVE MASSARA

Steve Massara, an Elkhorn, Neb., native, is graduating summa cum laude today with a bachelor of science in exercise science. The title of his commencement address is "A Foundation to Build Upon."

Dedicated to the campus community, Massara has been a member of UNO Student Government for his entire collegiate career. He recently completed a year-long term as Student Body President/Regent at UNO.

He said he is proud to have witnessed the enthusiasm fellow students express toward their interests on campus because it showcases the vibrant community of UNO. One such instance he treasures is the International Student Services Banquet, which is organized by students and allows for interaction between peers from more than 100 countries.

Holding a 4.0 G.P.A., Massara was named to the Dean's and Chancellor's Lists each semester for the past four years. A Regents Scholar, Peter Kiewit Distinguished Scholar and Pacesetter Phillip Schrager Scholar, he also excelled in the UNO Honors Program.

Among his numerous honors, the Vice Chancellor's Award, Gary A. Sallquist Leadership Award, and the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Undergraduate Service Award are among the most meaningful to Massara. He also represented UNO at a variety of national conferences and brought home the 2006 Student Government Pinnacle Award.

Massara was an active member of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, the Alliance of Fitness Professionals, Omicron Delta Kappa, Order of Omega, Emerging Leaders and John J. Mercer Lodge #290. He also served as a UNO Orientation leader and a UNO Ambassador, and was a Pacesetter Academy Educational Assistant.

An international travel enthusiast, Massara had the opportunity to venture to the Taj Mahal in India last May and also visited Mt. Everest Base Camp in Nepal, climbing for two weeks to 18,500 feet. Other pastimes he enjoys include hiking, camping, running, bicycling, reading, playing drums and singing.

In January, Massara will travel to Washington, D.C., to work in the office of Sen. Chuck Hagel. He also plans to enter the U.S. Air Force Officer Training School in July.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

MAGDALENA A. GARCIA

Magdalena Garcia is the founder and director of Omaha's El Museo Latino. Respected by many as a leader within the Omaha arts community, her accomplishments with the museum have helped further knowledge of and pride in Latino roots and culture.

Garcia founded El Museo Latino in 1993. It is one of just 11 Latino museums in the country, and the only one between Chicago and Denver. Since 1997, attendance at the museum has topped 50,000 visitors annually.

Occupying the former Polish Home cultural center in South Omaha, El Museo Latino has hosted several exhibits of national stature, including "Diego Rivera: The Brilliance Before the Brush," "Diego and Frida: A Smile at the Middle of the Road" and "The Potters of Mata Ortiz."

"Americanos: Latino Life in the United States" was the museum's first Smithsonian exhibition, organized in collaboration with actor Edward James Olmos in 2001. It highlighted 250 photographers in the United States to provide a glimpse of the diversity, richness, similarities and differences of Latinos in the United States.

Garcia began her studies at UNO as a business major, taking classes part time while working full time for Northern Gas, later Enron, in a human resources post. After volunteering to help at Omaha's Joslyn Museum, she developed a passion for museums. Changing her major to fine arts, she eventually earned a bachelor's degree in art history in 1988.

She went on to receive a master's degree in museum management in 1992 from Syracuse University, where she was enrolled in the museum studies program. While at Syracuse, Garcia held an internship as a management assistant at the Erie Canal Museum. Later, she was a museum intern at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art. She also has held posts at the Museum of Fine Arts-Houston (education assistant) and at Rice University's Sewall Art Gallery (exhibition assistant).

At El Museo Latino, Garcia directs the museum's extensive community efforts, including educational programs, art classes, lectures, workshops, artist-in-residencies, teacher in-service workshops and dance classes. The museum also organizes and presents events during the annual Cinco de Mayo celebration in May and Hispanic Heritage Month in September.

Her community contributions extend beyond the museum, as she is also an experienced dancer and choreographer in the tradition of Mexican folklorico dances. She also founded and is the artistic director of the CHOMARI Ballet Folkorico Mexicano, a teen/young adult dance company that has been performing since 1993.

She also has served or currently serves on the board of directors for numerous organizations, some of which include All Our Kids, the Nebraska Museum Association, the Omaha Schools Foundation, the Omaha Women's Fund, the State Records Advisory Board and the Omaha Landmarks Heritage Preservation Commission.

Since 1993, Garcia has taught as a part-time professor in the UNO Department of Art and Art History. She also has been an adjunct assistant professor in the museum studies program at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

The recipient of numerous awards throughout her career, Garcia has been honored by Daniel J. Gross High School, the Nebraska Humanities Council, the YWCA, United Way, the Mexican-American Veterans of the State of Nebraska and the Nebraska Arts Council.
