5. If you need a ride to the polls, voter assistance or have questions call 402-575-0144
6. If you need to register or to obtain an application for early voting, we will deliver the items to you, call 402-575-0144
7. Recognize that Black Votes Matter and North Omaha Votes Matter.
8. If you want to volunteer to help get the north Omaha vote out and/or provide rides to other voters, come visit the Black Votes Matter office at 2518 N. 24th (3 doors north of the Love Jazz and Art Center)
9. Primary Election Day, April 4th.
