From the Pace report at Analytics.unomaha.edu:

Just over 70% of all eligible undergraduate students have re-enrolled for Spring 2016. Of the 15,644 eligible, 4,652 are missing.

Keeping in mind that every 232 students equals about 5% of the total missing, notable groups of the non-enrolled include:

#### **Arts & Sciences**

Dean's Office: 574 (almost exclusively undeclared; 360 are Sophomores or higher)

Biology: 324 (@ 150 are Juniors/Seniors)

Psychology: 251

CBA

BSADBS/Undeclared: 634 students

CFAM

Art/Art History: 105 Communication: 106

COE

Teacher ED: 227 HPER: 107

IS&T

Computer Science: 156

ISQA: 63 Informatics: 53

#### **CPACS**

Dean's Office: 895 (Vast majority are Option 1 BGS)

Criminal Justice: 156 (Does not include Lincoln Campus CJ students)

Many of these students fall into the "Off-Pace" category meaning they are not accumulating many credits very quickly. Still, every 46/47 students enrolled before the end of next week adds another 1% to UNO's re-enrollment rate for Spring 2016.

Finally, from the <u>Head Count Analysis Report</u> within the Pace Porfolio, 1836 of the missing students were enrolled at UNO last semester. Our final re-enrollment rate was 76% for Fall 2015.

If anyone or their staff/advisors could use a refresher on how to access these reports for your college/departments, please do not hesitate to ask. You might recall that each report enables advisors to quickly drill down and identify unenrolled students that might be good candidates for a direct phone-call or email about re-enrolling.
