## Census 2000 Data

**Summary:** The long form of the 2000 Census collected income information from which poverty data are calculated. The long form was sent to a sample of households, with about 1 in 6 households across the United States receiving the long form. The 2000 Census had full (100%) nonresponse follow-up with those households that did not return the long form questionnaire.

**Strengths:** The long form data are from a large sample (1 in 6) with full nonresponse follow-up, increasing the data's accuracy, especially for racial and ethnic subpopulations.

**Weakness:** The 2000 Census data are not only dated but are summarized for the metro area boundaries in place at the time of the census (post 1990 census definitions). There have been two major updates to metro area definitions (in 2003 and 2013) since the 2000 census data were released. Thus the metro territories and definitions are much different today than in 2000, making comparisons over time difficult for some metro areas.

## 2006-2010 American Community Survey Data

Summary: The need for current information more often than once every ten years led to the creation of the American Community Survey (ACS). The ACS went national in 2005 with the sampling of group quarters (dorms, nursing homes, etc.) being added in 2006. To be more accurate a 5-year compilation of annual ACS data is used since the annual ACS sample is only about 1 in 40 households.

The 2006-10 timeframe is used since it is weighted to the 2010 Census counts, which are more representative of the population in certain metro areas as compared to the first 5-year release of ACS data covering 2005-2009 which were controlled to 2009 population estimates which had over and undercounts relative to the results of the full 2010 Census headcount.

Since the ACS is a survey using a sample of the population rather than the entire population, the ACS produces estimates, not actual counts. As a sample the ACS is also subject to sampling error. To aid data users the Census Bureau calculates and publishes a margin of error for every ACS estimate it produces. These margins

of error are not included on the following tables but asterisks are listed by metro areas that have relatively small Black or Hispanic populations since population size tends to drive data accuracy, with smaller population groups tending to have larger margins of error, warranting greater caution in using the associated data.

**Strengths:** The ACS data from 2006-2010 are relatively current. Economically, they represent two years of relatively good conditions, two years of recession, and one year of economic recovery, making them a fairly good representation of overall economic conditions that an area experiences.

**Weakness:** The 2006-10 ACS data are for the metro area boundaries as defined after the 2000 Census (2003 definitions). Thus, they are not as current as the new definitions used in the 2009-13 data. The ACS sampling rate is only about 1 in 8 households over 5 years, versus Census 2000 being about 1 in 6 households, so ACS data will usually not be as accurate as what Census 2000 data were. Only about 1 in 3 nonresponding households receive a follow-up visit and personal interview in the ACS methodology, versus full nonresponse follow-up in the 2000 Census.

The ACS went national in 2005 with the sampling of group quarters (dorms, nursing homes, etc.) being added in 2006. To be more accurate a 5-year compilation of annual ACS data is used since the annual sample is only about 1 in 40 households. The 2009-13 timeframe is the most current one available and is summarized for the newly released 2013 metro area definitions.

**Strengths:** The ACS data from 2009-2013 are current and provide our first look at the new metro area definitions that will be in place for the next several years. The ACS sample size was increased in 2011 so there are more total returns in the 2009-13 data than the 2006-10 ACS information, increasing the accuracy of the 2009-13 data.

**Weakness:** The 2009-13 sampling rate, while increased, is still less than the sampling rate of Census 2000. Additionally, nonresponse follow-up only occurs with about 1 in 3 nonresponding households in the ACS.

## Discussion about the 100 Most Populous Metro Areas and the Possibility for Sampling Error in the Data by Race and Ethnicity

Summary: When analyzing the 100 most populous metro areas, total population is the benchmark typically used. However, while these areas have a high total population they may not have large populations of certain racial and ethnic subgroups. There are many of the 100 most populous metro areas that do not have a very sizeable Black or Hispanic population. Generally, the smaller the population of a certain group, the less accurate the data for that certain group will be. Thus, as a sample ACS data have the possibility for sampling error, and even more so among small population subgroups.

To account for this possibility, a final set of rankings are compiled for the 100 metro areas that have the largest Black and Hispanic populations respectively. These metro areas were defined by the population for whom poverty was determined, which may differ from the overall population by race as people in group quarters (college dorms, prisons, etc.) do not have a poverty calculation.

The strength in these rankings of the 2009-13 data is that they are current as well as more accurate for poverty rates by race and ethnicity. Each metro in this analysis has a population for whom poverty was determined of at least 50,000 persons of each race. In comparison, several of the top 100 metro areas in total population have fewer than 20,000 Black or Hispanic residents, with a few having even less than 5,000 of a specific race. Thus, these rankings analyze those metro areas with the largest populations of specific racial and ethnic groups. Additionally, the 2009-13 data are for the newly released 2013 metro area definitions.

The weakness in this analysis is that the metro areas included in each ranking differ, and therefore direct comparisons of how a certain metro area ranks by race are more difficult and somewhat less intuitive. This analysis will also include metro areas less “well known” nationally for population size and exclude some other metro areas that would be widely recognized in a listing of the 100 most populous metro areas overall.

The data for the 100 most populous metro areas in Black and Hispanic population in 2000 are also provided in order to compare rankings of specific metros over time.
