Grant Applications

- Tell a story with the data, don't let the data be the story
- Connect to your work
- Language matters
- Think about proxy data

Tips

- Be clear, don't skirt around who are you serving
- Disaggregate data when possible + show progress when talking about impact
- Imagine the people you are serving will be reading the application- how would they feel?
- Own your organization's journey around being more accessible and equitable

Racism & Data

- Individual blame for systemic issues
- Who gets centered
- Considerations:
 - Who is deciding the design of the data collection?
 - How is the data being collected?
 - Who is analyzing the data?
 - Who gets access to the results you share? Only funders?
