# HHS students return from leadership camp

Four students who will be seniors at Hutchinson High School this fall recently returned from a weeklong camp designed to boost youth leadership skills.

The students are Erik Maland, Katie Jensen, Bo Connelly and Steph Vacek.

They attended the Wilder Forest camp near Stillwater through a program that is part of the National Youth Leadership Council.

The Hutchinson students were among about 32 students from a variety of school districts who were learning leadership skills involving such things as ethics, peace-keeping, community service and cultural diversity.

The first night there, the students spent the night outside as an exercise to build trust and team-

work with other campers.

"It was really rough because it was rainy and there was no food," Vacek said. But the exercise helped everyone to get to know each other, they said.

The group spent several days attending seminars pertaining to leadership skills and then separated to take part in community service projects.

Jensen helped create a Web page for a nonprofit organization. Vacek, Maland and Connelly did work at homeless shelters in Minneapolis and St. Paul.

Maland said the group hopes to start a youth group in Hutchinson that will focus on community service.

The students also hope their leadership training will benefit the groups they participate in at
