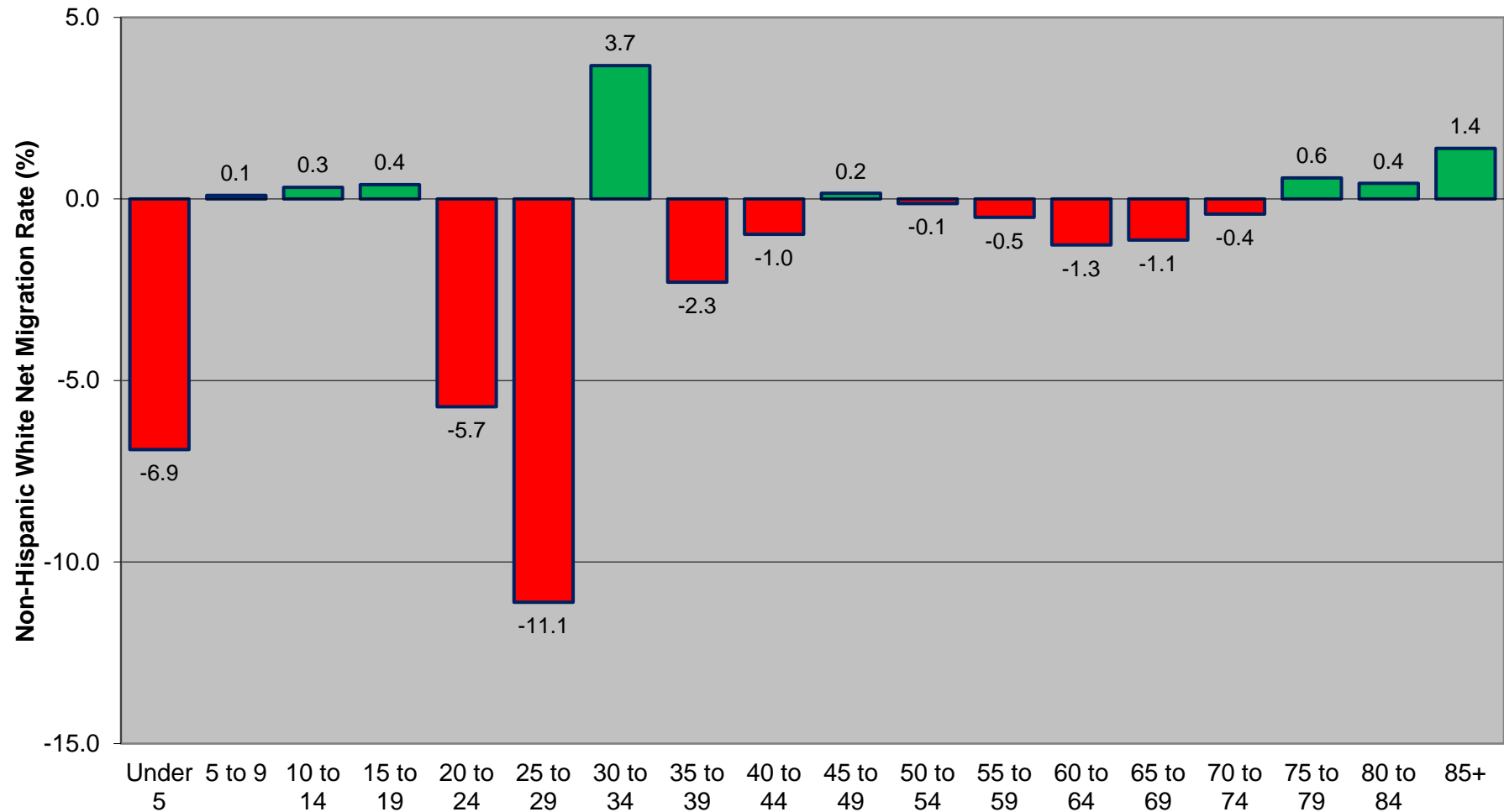

Overall 5-Year Net Migration Rate = - 1.7%



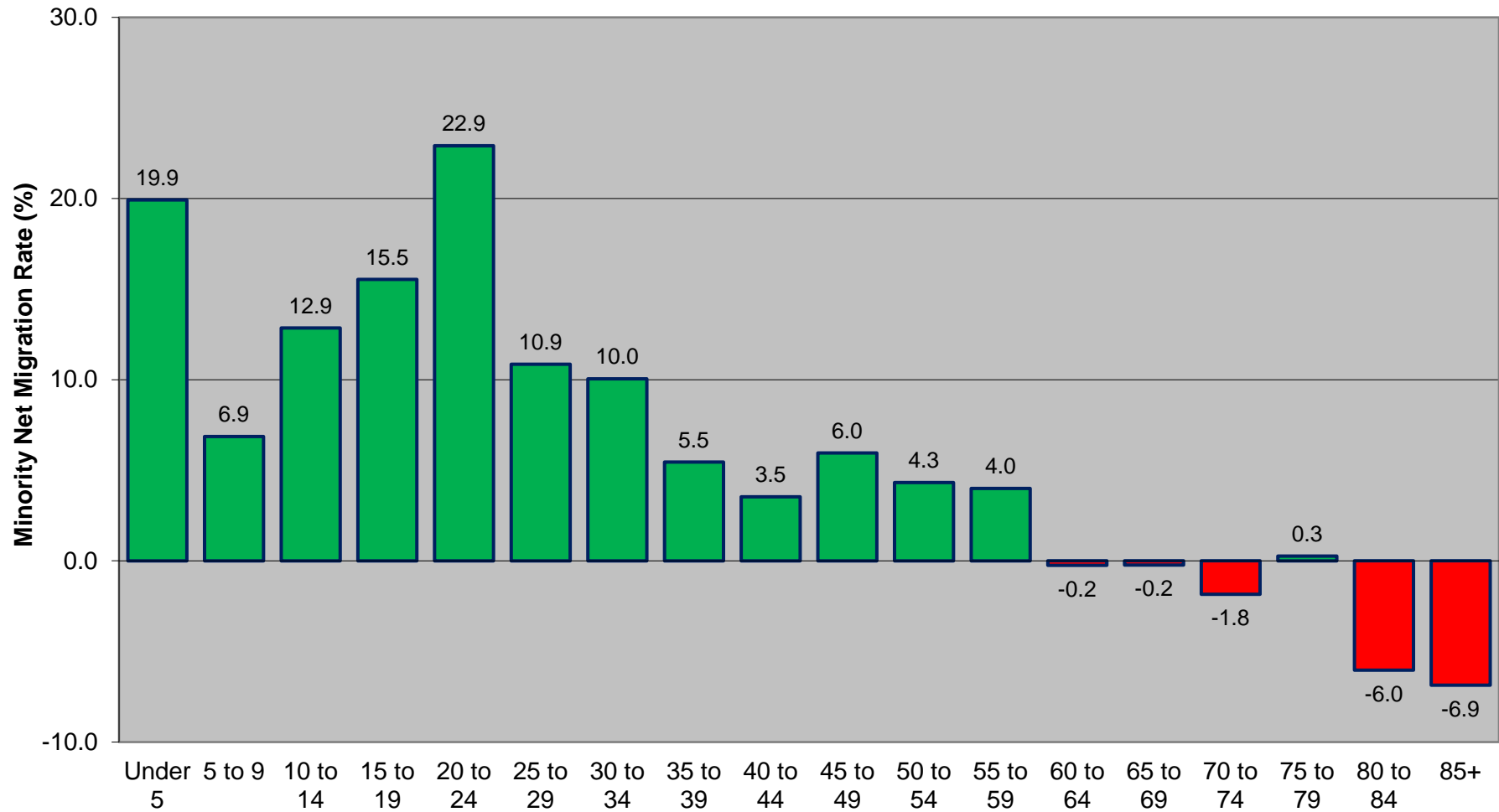

Overall 5-Year Net Migration Rate = 11.6%



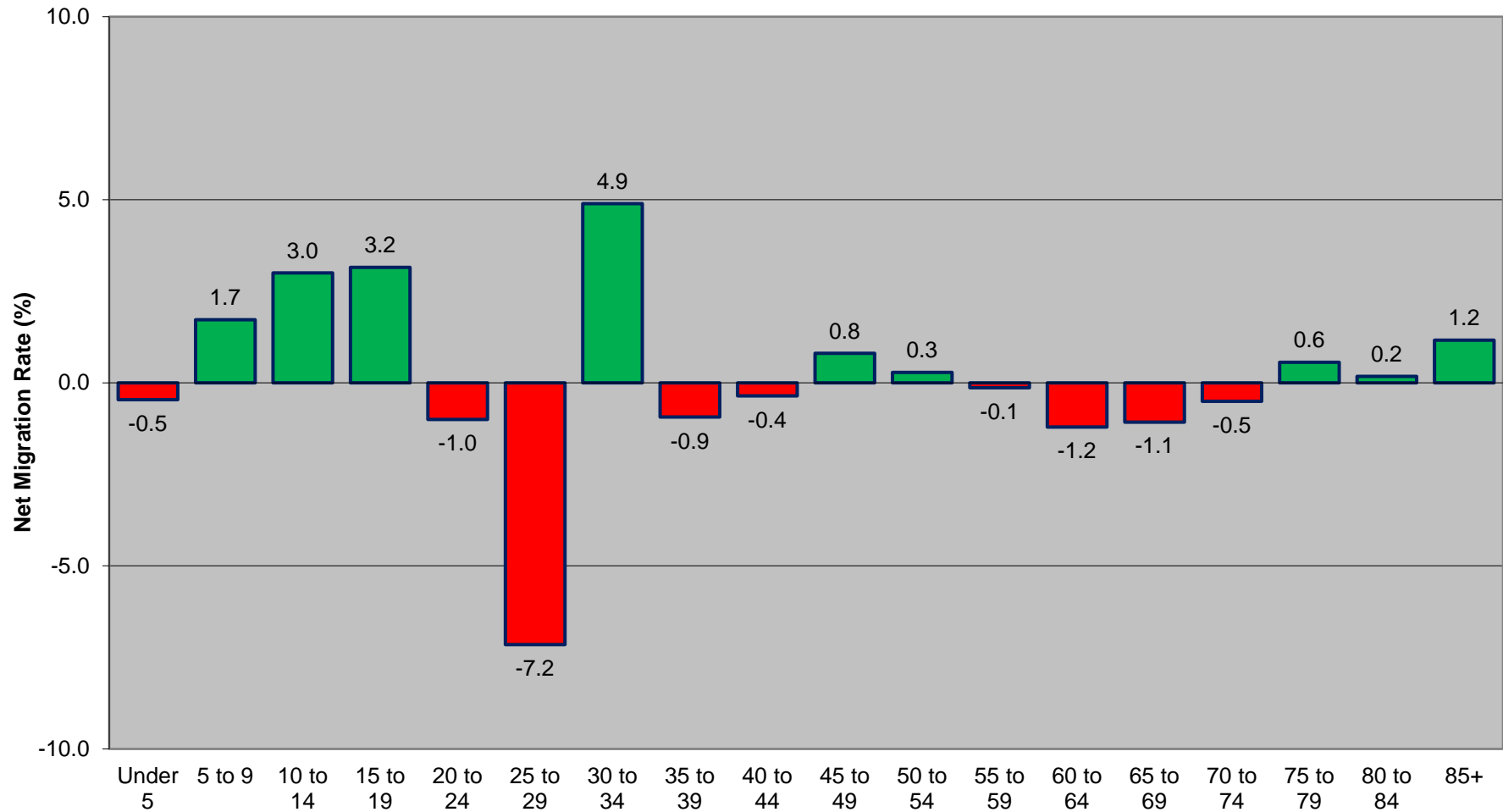
